Role Models

I must confess to being a little "over" the Australian political processes at the moment. It's probably lucky that our children give the party politicians little regard. If the Liberals say something is white, then Labour will argue that it's black (and vice-versa) just to have a point of difference. It's not exactly a great model for our children who witness the nastiness and vitriol that these leaders of our society dump into the media on a daily basis. Where are our champions? Where are those people that we want our students to aspire to be? Certainly not found in the political ranks.

We tend to leave the role models in the hands of sportsmen and philanthropists (like Bill Gates). Many of our sports people leave us wanting as well, though. I wouldn't want my child aspiring to be like some of our young tennis players, for example, who only seem to be in it for the money and fame and not for the love of the game.

It's also hard to find role models in the national media who seem obsessed with reporting the bad and obscene. Rarely do we find a feel-good story or an article on a person who is changing the world for the better. We need role models. We need them for us to realise that, at times, we can be better than we are. We need them for our children, for them to see the value that they are to others and inspire them to be like them.

Teaching is an outstanding profession as far as I'm concerned. I look at the teachers around here that genuinely care for their students, who provide positive role models (as do their parents!). Teachers are, with the parents, the "co-moulders" (is that a word?) of our future. By instilling in our children, the values and attitudes that will make them go far, we are also making our communities stronger, more caring and more loving.

Our greatest role model, as far as I'm concerned, was Jesus, who showed us how to treat others with care, respect and, dare I say it, love.

I was speaking with a psychologist at a conference some years ago and I happened to mention that I wasn't a lover of "The Simpsons" TV show. I pointed out that I considered Bart to be a bad role model. He agreed but went on to say that we need to identify the behaviours that are unacceptable and use them as a teaching tool to call out inappropriate behaviours.

As a Catholic School we highlight the goodness of Jesus as a model to which we should aspire. To remind ourselves that we share our giftedness with others and to allow others to realise that we are all created equally and deserve to be treated as such. That we are all loved by God unconditionally with all of our imperfections.

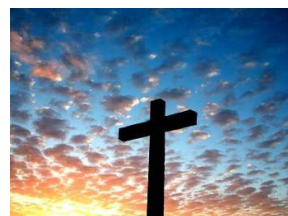

CHATTER MATTERS

Giving and listening to instructions

A key language feature of giving instructions is the use of verbs or action words. For example, when reading a recipe, you will notice the following action words are used; stir, fold, combine, melt, sift, bake etc. Children benefit from practise identifying these key words in a sentence. As they highlight for the child **what they need to do**.

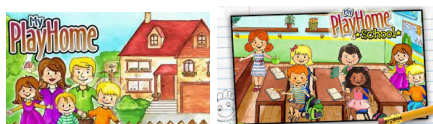
Here are a number of activities to practise identifying and using actions words/verbs.

- "Simon says" Take turns at being Simon and count how many different verbs each player uses. The one with the most verbs gets a bonus point. For example; **hop** on your left leg, **tickle** your tummy, **point** to the sky, **wiggle** your fingers.

- "read a recipe or list of instructions for a game" Highlight the different verbs used and discuss what they mean, for example "fold" can have a variety of meanings.

- when giving instructions ask your child to repeat the action words. Gradually increase the number of verbs, see how many they can remember for each instruction. For example, **pick up** your socks, **take** them to the laundry, **put** them in the washing machine, **turn on** the machine, **wait** until it's finished.

The following iPad apps are excellent for taking turns to give and follow instructions.

The importance of teaching our children Gratitude

Gratitude is the ability to pay attention to what you have, as opposed to worrying about the things you don't. Research tells us that after just 21 days of practicing gratitude, we rewire our brain to start scanning the world for the positive. This simple activity retrains us to experience greater levels of positive emotion.

I wonder who you feel grateful for today and why? Let them know!



Being Left Out



Being rejected and ostracised can hurt. Developing friendship skills at school may help young people to navigate relationships throughout their lives.

Developing friendship skills

The shift from home, where they are valued and loved, to school, where not everyone gets along, is a challenge all children face.

Learning friendship skills is the basis of emotional intelligence. Emotional intelligence is highly predictive of success in work and relationships in adult life.

Ideally children use school as a way to broaden their relationships, and this sets them up for being able to work with and relate to a variety of people during their adult years.

It is a strong human desire to belong. Belonging protects us and lessens anxiety. Understandably some children think that 'if I can just replicate that close caring relationship I have with Mum or Dad with one or two close special friends at school, all will be fine'.

However, becoming reliant on only a few friends has its dangers. Most people connect and reconnect with friends as they move through their lives.

Learning to cope with the ebb and flow of human relationships while remaining true to yourself gives people confidence and courage. At times, we all need to have the confidence to endure setbacks in friendships and the courage to be ourselves.

How parents can help children develop friendship skills

Parents can:

- Encourage friendships outside school.
- Model having a range of friends and how to meet new people.
- Increase social activities for the family with a range of people.
- Keep in touch with extended family members.
- Encourage the idea of being friends with an array of people rather than just being close to a few people.

Consider going through a list of your child's classmates with them and identifying the different types of friends. If someone is rejecting or ostracising them, you can explain that there is no point trying to push friendship upon people who are rejecting it. Tell your child that sometimes you need to take a break—when you back off from people, they can move towards you. Try to help identify a few more people to play with and become better friends with.

- Students are revising our Reading comprehension strategies

Writing

- A grammar focus on sentence writing continues.
- Question marks, commas, full stops, capital letters and spelling.

Religion:

This week the students are finishing the unit, "The Eucharist", by exploring the Eucharistic Prayer and correlating it with the Scripture of the Last Supper and the Eucharistic celebration at Mass. The students describe and explain some of the symbols and rituals of the Mass.

Literacy:

The students have been applying what they have learnt about reading and interpreting information and writing it in their own words. Following on, the students are finishing, editing and presenting PowerPoint presentations on their explorer, which they have been investigating in this term's Inquiry unit.

The spelling focus this week is revision of sounds learnt this term and High Frequency words that the students have used in their stories.

Parents, please encourage your child or children to continue reading over the holiday break.

Numeracy:

This week the students are exploring and further developing their understanding of addition and subtraction using different strategies that help solve different digit problems. Through games, such as 'Around the World' (using 4 dice), 'I Spy' & '99 or Bust' and activities using MAB blocks, dice, playing cards and place value mats. The students are partitioning, rearranging and regrouping numbers to help develop and expand their mental strategies to assist calculations and solve addition and subtraction problems.

Inquiry:

This week the students are presenting their PowerPoint presentations to the class. They are also attempting to draw their explorer's principle voyage on a map.
