Parents at School – Assemblies etc

With the easing of the COVID restrictions, it was wonderful to welcome parents back to our school last Friday to look at our Book Parade. Some were also able to stay for our Assembly straight afterwards. It was so nice to have our parents back at school supporting us all.

Under current guidelines, **parents are allowed to enter school**. Parents must QR code into the school and wear a mask.

Currently, you cannot enter buildings, except for the office, without showing your vaccination status. This needs to be done at the office. Whilst on the school site, parents and visitors must wear a mask at all times. I realise that this must be a "pain in the neck" for some but at least it gets our parents back onsite in a safe way for all.

Assemblies will be held at 9.00am in the pavilion until the end of the year as we can accommodate many more parents at school if we do this. Please ask if you have questions as your involvement in our school does immeasurable good for the students in our school.

Coming into school to picking up or drop off students is also allowed. Please QR code in at the gate to comply with current regulations. Picking up and dropping of is limited to 15 minutes.

Face Masks

We ask that parents send their child to school with a face mask if they are in Years 3 to 6. Please make sure that they are appropriately marked as they are only required to be worn indoors and the students are not required to wear them during recess/lunch times whilst outdoors (unless they choose to do so).

The school has a limited number of masks to supply to students who lose or break theirs whilst at school to ensure that we maintain a standard.



New Face Mask Regulations

We have received new directives from the Victorian Chief Health Officer regarding the wearing of face masks at school for Primary aged students (Years 3 to 6). I have included the relevant directives from the current government guidelines (below).

1. Please see coronavirus.vic.gov.au for the latest face mask requirements. For all school settings, the Victorian Chief Health Officer Directs:

• students in Year 3 to Year 6 to wear face masks when indoors on school premises, unless an exception applies

• **Recommends** that all other children wear face masks when at school, attending an OSHC program, or when travelling to and from school on public transport, taxis or ride share vehicles. There are a number of lawful reasons for not wearing a face mask, including for staff and students who are unable to wear a face mask due to the nature of their disability, medical or a mental health condition.

A face mask must cover the nose and mouth. Face shields, scarves or bandanas do not meet these requirements.

We ask that parents send their child to school with a face mask if they are in Years 3 to 6. Please make sure that they are appropriately marked as they are only required to be worn indoors and the students are not required to wear them during recess/lunch times whilst outdoors (unless they choose to do so).

Current COVID Restrictions for Schools

Just a reminder to parents that you can only come onto the school site for essential reasons. If you are dropping your child off it is preferable that you do this at one of the school gates - Ovens St and Ryley St. If you do need to come into any of the school buildings, <u>you must enter through the front office and check in, regardless of the time spent in the building. YOU MUST WEAR A MASK AT ALL TIMES. PLEASE do not enter any of the classrooms through the school grounds.</u>

Outside of School Hours Care (OSHC) Parents may enter the school via the Ovens St Gate to collect their child/ren from child care. They are only permitted to the front entrance of the hall to sign their child out. A mask must be worn at all times please.

School Operations Guide

The latest school Operations guidelines require that:

- Hand hygiene and cleaning regimes are in place
- Visitors are restricted to staff and health and wellbeing support with record keeping
- No assemblies or liturgies
- Libraries can be open
- Shared drink taps open
- Sports programs are permitted with conditions

COVID Action Unwell Students

Families are asked to keep students exhibiting symptoms similar to cold and flu at home until the symptoms go or they have been cleared by a doctor. It is important that we are all vigilant when it comes to spotting potential problems with COVID 19.

School Hats

During term four school hats are required to be worn outside as part of the school's Sunsmart Policy. Students who do not have a hat will be restricted to play under the pavilion at school to protect them from the sun. Hats need to be sun safe (baseball style caps are not permitted).

Religion -

This week the students will continue to revise multiplication and division. The students will write, draw and investigate many worded multiplication and division problems.

Friday 'Fun Day' (Friday 3rd December):

In lieu of the 3/4 camp that was unable to take place due to COVID restrictions, we have decided to provide our students with a 'Fun Day' at school, this Friday December 3rd. This day will celebrate the students' achievements and resilience shown throughout the Remote Learning period. Staff will provide the necessary items on the day, however students will be required to pack their recess and a light lunch. There is no cost involved and students are required to wear their regular school uniform.

Swimming:

The Year 3/4 swimming program commences next week, with students travelling to the Indoor Sports & Aquatic Centre to participate in 45 minute sessions. These will take place on Monday 6th, Wednesday 8th, Thursday 9th and Friday 10th of December. Please note that there will be NO swimming session on Tuesday 7th due to the state-wide transition day.

Homework:

This week's homework task involves the completion of a cloze activity on the topic of Sharks. Students will be required to select the correct words in order to complete coherent and logical sentences. This will be the final homework task for the year.

Literacy:

The students are currently utilising their previously written scripts as part of the filming of their short animation films. In Reading, students are continuing to complete a range of comprehension activities, based on both fiction and non-fiction text types, which includes using and identifying figurative language as well as exploring and responding to the media platforms Kids News and Behind the News (BTN) and National Geographic Kids Magazine.

Inquiry:

Students are working on their dioramas and using iMotion technology to create animations in their films. Our Google Computer Science lessons are helping students learn how they can incorporate good dialogue with figurative language to create interesting characterisation in their films. The students never cease to amaze us with their skills in technology!

Mathematics:

This week the Year 3/4 classes are commencing a new unit on three-dimensional shapes. Students will investigate the geometric properties and attributes of 3D shapes by manipulating a variety of objects and using the correct terminology to describe their features.

Religious Education:

Students continue to analyse the history of the Jesse Tree and its role in depicting the historical descent of Jesus. Students are exploring stories from the Old and New Testaments that show how

Social Media - Top Tips for Parents

- Talk to children about online privacy issues, making sure they know to never to identify personal information such as their full name, address, age, school and don't ever post photos in school uniform.
- Teach your children to respect people's privacy and don't share anyone else's personal information online without permission.
- Don't tag photos of your children at their school if your accounts are not set to completely private. This is a child safety issue as anyone driving past can search the school on Instagram and see all of the photos that have been tagged at the school, often by parents who have not set their account to private on Instagram. If your account is not completely private, anyone can see your photos of your child, their name, the name of the cat ,where you go on holiday, what your family does on weekends, when birthdays were and other information about your family and your life. Therefore a complete stranger could make up a story that could be very convincing to your child by using the information you have shared in a public forum of more than 500million users.
- If you are going to post anything with a significant fact, check it first.
- Teach your children to understand the importance of passwords, keeping them private and changing regularly.
- Learn how to recognise a scam. If it is too good to be true, it probably is.
- Make sure the apps you allow your kids to use are age appropriate.
- Don't be patronising or insulting to anyone. This kind of behaviour validates bad behaviour in children as they often see it if you are connected to young people on social media.

- Ban devices from the bedroom from as young as possible. Set boundaries around use.
- Share pictures and videos only with consent. And respect the privacy of others.
- Keep your love-life and arguments off social media.
- Stay positive. If you see something you disagree with don't engage.
- Consider the fact that children in the background of photos or videos you take at your child's school may be on "no publish" lists. Some children are in protective custody or witness protection and an innocent photo posted on social media could be disastrous.
- Teach young people not to say, or repeat anything that they wouldn't say if the person were standing right in front of them.
- Recognise that other people's opinions may be different to their own and that does not give them permission to attack those opinions online.
- Remember that even an emoji can be taken out of context by someone reading it.
- Use your head and your heart and don't let emotion be the only thing driving you to post.
- Make sure you respect classification on games, they are there for a reason.
- Make sure the young people in your care know that under no circumstances they should go and meet up with anyone they meet online. Stranger Danger rules apply because they are now literally on digital steroids and 24x7.

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
