Walk a mile in their shoes

I find it relatively easy to raise money for Caritas during Lent because, with such a focus on giving to the poor, it's not hard to see the need. If I'm hungry, I get something to eat. Thirsty, something safe and clean to drink. I break a shoe, then I buy some new ones. If I'm hot, I turn on the cooler. Cold, I turn on the heater. Well, you get the picture.

These people don't have the luxury of choice. They don't have any luxuries. If they're hungry they'll eat whatever they can. Taste isn't a factor. Survival is! Clothes get damaged, then they fix them as best they can until they can find a way to scavenge other clothes. I stop wearing things sometimes because I feel fat in them (sad I know) but these people just have to make do with whatever comes along (not that any of them would ever feel fat!).

We take so many things for granted. We do live in a lucky country and we are lucky to have the things that we do. I'm not surprised that refugees would risk their lives to get here. Goodness, if I was a refugee, I'd want to be here too. But many can't and the least we can do is make their world a little better by giving a little something that might help improve their lives. I think CARITAS embraces the old adage, "Give a man a fish and you feed him for a day. Teach a man to fish and you feed him for a lifetime". Contributing to CARITAS does just that, improves lives.

I know that I am drawing a "tenuous bow" with some of you when I say that each act of kindness is also a gift from God. I believe that it's the love that we have within us that causes us to do acts of kindness. That love is the same love that God has for all of us. It's generous, unselfish and uncompromising. Jesus gave us many models to look after the poor, the sick and the marginalised. Giving to CARITAS is, I believe, being Jesus' hands on earth. Carrying on his legacy.

So thank you for the Easter Eggs for our raffle, for the students who generously put money in the CARITAS boxes in the classrooms, to the students who fundraised for CARITAS and the many other acts of kindness that you do whether or not it is noticed or unnoticed.

WHAT'S HAPPENING IN THE CLASSROOM

FOUNDATION - Caz & Trish

Welcome to week 7, we hope you enjoyed the long weekend with your children.

Last Friday, the staff attended a professional development day which was presented by occupational therapist, Sally McNamara.

It was a very insightful day and she highlighted the importance of **core strength** in children. It is highly connected to poor fine motor skills if a child displays poor core strength.

Currently children in Australia have poor core strength and it impacts on many areas of their learning.

Her recommendations to improve and strengthen core muscles were:

- Get children on their tummies, reading on their tummy.
- Children working in a kneeling position for short times.
- Have short sitting times. Get up and move.
- Be physically active more regularly each day. It is recommended that children between 5-17 need 60 minutes a day.
- Children are to carry their <u>own</u> school bags correctly on their backs. This assists shoulder stability which provides strength in the hands and fingers which in turns assists fine motor skills.

REMINDER-

- Tonight @ 5.00pm-7.00pm we will hold the school sports at Appin Park. Please feel free to bring along a picnic tea.
- We ask if you could return the school nurse envelope ASAP please.

Religion: We continue our unit, 'What do we know about Jesus?' by reading stories about his life as a young boy and man. Every day the students are encouraged to name the 'Bible' as a special book that tells us about Jesus' life.

We are also discussing Lent and ways that we can show how we are walking more in the footsteps of Jesus by; doing jobs at home to earn a little money that we could put into the Project Compassion boxes in our rooms, bringing in an Easter Egg for the raffle for Caritas etc.

Literacy: Big Books - Levesque - 'Mrs Wishy Washy's Tub', Shaw - 'Smarty Pants'.

The students will continue to enjoy listening and reading the big books each day. The students will focus on looking at the pictures and the starting letter to help them read. The students will continue to rhyme and use syllables. During writing, the students will continue to 'write' and draw a message for others to read. They will focus on, 'I can write down what I hear' and 'I need spaces between words when I write a sentence.'

Reader bags: These are to come to school every day. In this bag there is often important notes or messages as well.

Mathematics: Our topic is 'Length' and the students will look at different objects and make comparisons to decide which one is longer.

Inquiry: The students will continue to investigate materials and how certain things are made in the unit, 'Bridge and Beyond'. We will be taking the students on a walking excursion to look at everyday structures and how they are built. The excursion will happen on **Wednesday the 25th March at approximately 11.45am and returning at approximately 1.30pm.** You will receive a permission note for this next week. We are happy for any parent helpers to come along. However, we cannot take any younger siblings with us as our duty of care is for the students. Thank you for your cooperation on this matter.

RRRR - Emotional Literacy

Students will recognise what sorts of sounds are associated with different emotions.

YEAR ONE/TWO – Janina, Amanda, Elise, David, Karen & Leah

Welcome to Week 7.

The students have been enjoying preparing for tonight's twilight sports. We look forward to sharing this night with you.

Thank you for your donations of cardboard tubes (lucky we don't need toilet rolls) - we are hoping to complete our 'Light and Sound' project very soon, so we would love for lots more to come in.

This week's learning focus-

Religion - we continue with our unit 'Lent' through discussions and activities that focus on this being a time to be more like Jesus. We will continue to listen to bible stories showing the kindness Jesus shared with his family and friends. This will also encourage the students to think about random acts of kindness during this Lenten season.

During Lent, our school supports the Catholic organisation 'Caritas' who provide important care to those less fortunate. Each classroom has their own donation box and we encourage the school community to make a small donation. Did you know \$5 will buy 3 packets of vegetable seeds for home gardening for a family living in Cambodia. It only takes seconds to make the world a better place. Are you with us?

Easter egg raffle - as a part of our Caritas donation this Lenten season, we have an Easter egg raffle. We are hoping families may be able to donate an Easter egg and sell raffle tickets. Please see the office if you require raffle tickets.

Literacy - We will look at the spelling patterns involving the sounds 'nt' as in tent and magic 'e' as 'o' in hope. The students will be encouraged to listen for these sound patterns and manipulate the sound combinations to spell familiar and less familiar words.

Through handwriting sessions, the students will be encouraged to focus on correct pencil grip and body posture.

Each week, the students are encouraged to write detailed recounts, drawing on their own experiences. We continue to also focus on narratives, with the particular focus on the language features of characters, settings and events. Through reading and writing sessions, the students are encouraged to focus on the literal and implied meaning and to make connections between the texts.

Mathematics - this week we continue to explore 'Number and place value' through the reading and writing of numbers, counting on and adding in your head. The students will explore and recognise patterns in number sequences such as 'when counting by fives, there are 2 steps' and 'counting by tens increases in the tens place however, the ones stay the same'. We will explore relationships between counting sequences such as '4's is double 2's and find the missing elements in the number sequence. Linking addition to everyday events will assist the students with their number calculations. Our focus will also include developing the important strategies of doubles, near doubles, adding 10 and fact families.

Religious Education:

In our new unit, 'Lent: Preparing for Easter' students are introduced to the period of Lent and Easter as seasons in the Church's liturgical year and are given the opportunity to explore how the community prepares for Easter through prayer, penance and good works. Students will be encouraged through the events of Holy Week to remember and celebrate the life, death and resurrection of Jesus, and come to recognise Easter as the most important event in the Church year.

THANK YOU BERTSY & CO FOR SUPPORTING OUR SCHOOL

This week, the third week of Lent, our students will learn all about the story of Barry, an Indigenous Gamilaroi man from Western NSW. Barry is a mental health professional at a regional hospital and he also facilitates workshops for the 'Red Dust Healing', an initiative of Caritas Australia. '*This program encourages participants to reflect on their own personal hurt and begin to heal from within. Family and personal relationships are addressed, alongside unhelpful patterns of behaviour that have developed over a long period of time to help "cope" with the difficulties of life.' (Caritas Australia, 2020)*

Literacy:

In **Reading** we are continuing to focus on 'Thinking Within the Text', specifically concentrating on monitoring, self-correcting and maintaining fluency. Students will be engaging in focus groups to support this development as well as reading rotations that include Reader's Theatre, Reading Eggspress discussion groups and completion of comprehension tasks.

In **Writing** this week students are continuing to develop multiple choice questions or statements related to our Inquiry study of 'Forces and Functions'. These will be used to develop a Scratch presentation during ICT sessions (Thursday rotations) over the coming weeks. **Spelling** Focus: _*oa as in road and coach*; _*ow as in below*

Homework:

For Week 7 students have tasks related to Reading, Spelling and Mathematics. Please support your child to complete each component of the homework and fill in their reading log in their homework book (including a comment). This week the Spelling task involves writing sentences using nouns, adjectives and alliteration. For Maths, students are required to construct numbers **(using the deck of cards provided for home use)** and rename them according to the conditions outlined on the place value charts provided. Homework is due back this **Friday the 13th March**.

Numeracy:

This week in Numeracy we continue our focus on Place Value. Students are exploring **partitioning** (the breaking apart of numbers - eg 2345 = 2000 + 300 + 40 + 5) as well as how to efficiently add 10, 100 and 1000 by focusing on patterns.

Inquiry:

We are nearing the end of the 'Forces' experiments and this week, students will revisit their balloon powered car designs in preparation for the construction and testing processes that will occur over the following fortnight.

4Rs (Resilience, Rights and Respectful Relationships)

This week in our Thursday rotations, students are exploring 'emotions in the school day', classifying them as positive or negative, and identifying situations or scenarios where these are present in the classroom as well as the playground.

Library:

Our St Patrick's class library is open for business and we have begun to borrow books to take home. Please ensure your child has a bag to take home library books from school. This can be any form of bag including a long life shopping bag. However, if the bag is more distinguishable it is easier for your child to remember and find. Students who do not have a **book bag** will need to keep their books at school until they bring one from home.

Events Coming up:

Twilight Picnic Sport:

The St Patrick's Twilight Sports are on TONIGHT from 5.00pm to 7.00pm. We would like to see as many of our senior students as possible. We decided to move the sports to term 1, as it provides a great opportunity for new families to meet. Don't forget to bring a picnic dinner to eat on the grass as you support your children.

Curriculum Foci:

Numeracy Focus - ReSolve Investigation.

In mathematics we are investigating algebraic patterns of chicken boxes. The students are constructing different shaped boxes and formulating relative rules using algebra to express the pattern of the array. The students are also using excel spreadsheet to model the pattern.

Literacy Focus - Reading and writing a variety of information reports

We will be focusing on information reports for the rest of the term linking in with our Inquiry topic as we research and learn about discoveries.

Religious Education

The Project Compassion theme this Lenten season is *Going Further Together*. We will be focusing on the stories of the people who have benefited from the fundraising from Caritas and their projects around the world. The Social Justice and House Leaders will be organising the Caritas Ks Walkathon during the last week of term.

Inquiry - The Journey to Discovery (Game Changers and Change Makers)

Each class will learn about a STEAM concept relating to the topic of Game Changers and Change Makers. Classes will work together to plan and develop an Expo to share their understanding of the concept. Within classes, students will work in small creative teams to contribute information/displays/exhibition/experiments to share within their classes.

This year at our MAYFAIR, the Year 5/6's will again be running a sustainability stall. If you have any vintage or 2nd hand clothing, please send it along to our classrooms. We are also looking for 2nd hand sports gear/equipment/shoes etc that can be sold at our stall. Any items would be greatly appreciated.

Homework

Homework commenced last week. The purpose of homework at St Patrick's Primary School is to provide a positive attitude towards learning fostered through the provision of regular and meaningful homework. This in turn encourages a sense of responsibility and independence in the child. This year, the 5/6 teachers will be monitoring homework twice a Term. Students are encouraged to manage their time (with parental support) and record evidence of their learning in their homework grid and book. Homework is due on **Thursday 26th March**.
