# **One Solitary Life!**

I've just been watching a bit of the rehearsal for tonight's school concert. It truly is a beautiful time of the year (albeit it a little hectic at times!). I love the Nativity (The story of Jesus' birth), because it is a beautiful beginning to a life story that has taught humankind so much about joy and compassion. It's nice to take time to reflect on the birth of Jesus. As I got older, I came to appreciate more the depth to Jesus' story. I found this reflection a number of years ago and it still causes me to think deeply on what the birth of Jesus truly means:

Here is a man who is born of Jewish parents, the child of a peasant woman.

He never wrote a book; He never held an office;

He never owned a home; He never had a family;

He never went to university; He never set foot inside a big city;

He never travelled 200 miles from the place where he was born.

He never did one of the things that usually accompany greatness

He had no credentials, but himself.....

While still a young man, the tide of opinion turned against him

His friends ran away..... One of them denied him......

He was nailed to a cross between two thieves

His executioners gambled for the only piece of property that he had on Earth, his coat

When he was dead, he was taken down and laid in a borrowed grave through the pity of a friend.

Twenty wide centuries have come and gone, and he is the centrepiece of the human race and the leader of a column of progress

I am far within the mark when I say..... that all the armies that ever marched, and all the navies that were ever built have not affected the life of people upon Earth as powerfully as has that .....

The children will have an opportunity to express an opinion and do their best to

#### Year Two
