LEARNING WALK

A big thankyou to all of those who attended our Learning Walk on Tuesday. It was great to observe how our students learn in their classroom and how teachers engage the students to strive to do their best.

Next term we will hold another walk which will focus on Maths.

CHATTER MATTERS

An activity to build vocabulary, Morphology: Morphological awareness is a skill that helps students read and spell. It involves breaking up words into their base word, prefixes, and suffixes. These can be added or taken away from a word to alter its meaning. For example, the word unhelpful can be broken into: a prefix – un (meaning not), base word – help, and a suffix – ful (meaning full of). This could be explained as: not full of help.

Resilience, Rights and Respectful Relationships

Help Seeking. This week the focus will be:

- Students investigate developmental changes and transitions
- Students recognise the influence of emotions on behaviours and discuss factors that influence how people interact
- Students describe their own and others' contributions to health, physical activity, safety and wellbeing

Religion: This week, in the unit, 'I Care For God's World.' We will be looking closely at nature and the many beautiful things God has created for us. In this unit students will begin to appreciate and express wonder at God's creation. They will be introduced to the fact that they have certain responsibilities to live in harmony with creation. Students are asked to collect and bring pieces of nature they may have found for the class nature table.

Literacy: The Foundation students will work through a variety of activities related to the big book in their class. They will continue to write lists, letters and wanted posters relating to the big book. The students continue to practise the most used words daily and sounds and letters.

Foundation Levesque - ' Mrs Wishy Washy's Big Wash '. Foundation Shaw - 'Jigaree'.

Thank you to the parents who have been able to read with the students, we appreciate your time. A huge thank you to the wonderful reading routines that have been established. Congratulations to the students and families who have read over 50 nights.

Mathematics: We have been looking at using money and what it looks like. We have investigated how different notes and coins are worth different amounts and what we can buy with different amounts This week the students have continued to revise numbers between 0-20 and 1-100. Students will say, write and make the numbers. We are counting backwards consistently from a given number, to consolidate the patterns found in numbers.

Inquiry: This week during the unit, '**Our Sustainable World**' the students will use their senses to look, feel and smell different elements of the environment. They have been creating artworks about the environment.

RRRR's: The students will create their own poster on the people who help them at home and at school.

Show and Tell:

This week - Something that starts with the last letter of your name. **Next week -** An item that has numbers on it.

Literacy:

The week in spelling we are focusing on the 'n' as in nip and 'cr' as in crack. In our literacy groups we are continuing our focus on compound words and question marks. Students continue to enjoy reading and writing their own information reports and are becoming more and more confident in including a title, general statement, description and evaluation in their writing. We look forward to sharing these at our upcoming expo.

Linking with our inquiry, this week we will be reading and watching 'The Lorax' by Dr Seuss. We will be comparing these two stories using a Venn Diagram to organise our ideas.

NEWS:

- This week Share a special memory from a chosen celebration, this may include baptism, birthday or Christmas etc. Students may like to bring in something special from one of these celebrations such as the candle which they received at the time of their baptism. (This links with our current Religion unit 'Sacraments Are Special Celebrations'.)
- Next week My favourite part of the story 'The Lorax' was... I learnt...

Numeracy:

In numeracy this week students are exploring subtraction. We will be looking at the connection between addition and subtraction in addition to solving simple addition and subtraction problems using a range of efficient mental and written strategies.

Following on from our unit on 'Time' we encourage our families to keep referring to the time on an analogue clock, daily. Focus on telling the time to the hour, half hour as well as quarter past and to.

Inquiry:

As a part of the Year 1/2 Inquiry topic 'Tip Toe Through Our World', we are collecting scraps of material and pillowcases which could be recycled into something new. Boomerang bags will be made using old pillowcases, so if families have any odd pillowcases, they might like to donate it would be greatly appreciated.

We are also interested in hearing from any parents/grandparents/friends who may be able to assist with some simple sewing projects.

On Tuesday 25th June, from 2.30pm-3.30pm we will be having an expo to showcase our learnings for the term. We would like to invite our families and friends to come into our classrooms during this time.

In conjunction to the expo, this time will be an opportunity for students to swap a book or toy, linking in with our focus of reduce, reuse and recycle. If families would like to donate an old book or toy that they no longer use and bring into school prior to this day it would be greatly appreciated.

Religion:

This week in the unit, "Sacraments of Initiation: Eucharist', the students are researching some of the times and places where Jesus gathered with his friends for a meal and the actions of Jesus when he was with them. The students are then linking these findings to scripture passages in the Bible and then creating a dramatisation of the passage. For example, Lk 22: 14-20 which recalls how Jesus shared a very special meal with his disciples (the first Holy Thursday).

Literacy/Inquiry:

This week our students continue looking at the structure of an information report and how to take notes from information they have read and putting it into their own words. Following guidelines set out in this term's Inquiry unit, students will begin researching their chosen 'endangered animal'. This will be presented as a PowerPoint presentation.

Our spelling focus this week contains words with 'pl, sl, cl, fl, gl, bl'

Homework:

Homework is a little different this week. So please check your child's homework book! Students are expected to read each evening and record a comment in their reading log to describe what they have learnt/where they are up to in their story. <u>Please check that this is happening.</u>

Numeracy:

This week students will begin exploring and choosing appropriate written subtraction strategies such as the jump strategy, split strategy and vertical subtraction to solve subtraction problems.

Business arising from previous minutes:

Principals Report:

- Clearance of VRQA
- Needed to have an up to date Child Safety policy. Terry has ordered signs they show that we are a Child Safe school. Terry has ordered 6 signs to be displayed around the classroom.
- Terry has a meeting with Trish Miller next week regarding funding for Catholic Schools. We have a capital grant to demolish the old school, we just need funding for the new building. Which is what the meeting is about next week.
- Demolish 2 classroom and get rid of the portables.
- Our project is 3 million, this grant will be better for us.
- Terry needs to work out where the builders will be coming in and out and make it safe for the children. He wants to talk to the P&F and get some ideas from them. We want to make sure that we leave plenty of playing space for the children.
- The grant goes in on the 5th of July we might find out about September.
- Learning Walk on the 11th of June. If any parents are able to attend, that would be great. If P&F could promote our learning walk that would be great.

Treasurer Report:

- Sara has provided each P&F Mayfair break down.
- After paying all the bills for the Mayfair we raised \$15, 385.53
- \$44, 000 are in both accounts. Next statement will have the Mayfair bills.
- Bendigo Bank has put their hand up to help at the Mayfair next year.

Bunnings Community Program:

- Bunnings have a community program such as a sausage sizzle or a cake stall. They have said they can raise up to \$1,000.
- They run a program about gardens, and they come out to schools. It is a free program and it would assist with our garden guru's program. Bunning will donate plants etc. It could be trees in pots, talk about how children can garden or irrigation system.
- Kyra will get more information and pass it on the Nara Nicoll and Caz Levesque.

Colour Run/Obstacle Course:

- There is no ideal weekend in October and November, so Shae and Bridgett thought we could do it at the start on first term.
- Bridgett has come up with a great idea about an obstacle course. It could be done in school time at Merriwa park as it will take up a lot of space. Bridgett is passing around images of the obstacle course. Bridgett has said that it would be about 40 minutes per age group and has thought they age groups could go separately during the day. The cost is about \$2,000 and P&F could fund the course. We could also provide hotdogs for lunch after the children have been on the course. Terry was thinking we could do the obstacle course late November/Early December and the Colour Fun Run term 1 next year 2020.
- Bridgett was thinking around March long weekend for the Colour Fun run. Terry to work out dates.
- Leah was reading the newsletter and saw that some parents thought that the cost of the Colour Fun Run was expensive. However, Leah thought it was reasonable as the fox run cost \$35.00 per child.
