Chatter Matters

Receptive language or the ability to understand what people are saying underpins all areas of the school curriculum including social and personal capabilities.

The following activities will promote students' abilities to:

- Follow longer and more complex instructions/ information.
- Develop concept knowledge, e.g. before/after, until, if.
- Understand the language of literacy/academic vocabulary.
- Show they understand or request clarification

Asking complex questions

For every simple question you ask your child, ask two *complex* ones. For example; Simple question: What's that a picture of? (This only requires a one-word answer)

Complex questions: Tell me how you made/drew that? What do you think that character might be saying in this picture? Why did the lady do that?

Religion: Our unit for the beginning of this term is, "**Called to Live Like Jesus**". The students have been viewing books about 'kindness' and what it looks like. They have responded through discussion and role-playing different scenarios. The students have discussed a time when someone was like Jesus towards them and drawn a picture about it.

Literacy: Big Books: Mrs Patterson, 'The Jigaree' Mrs Shaw, 'The Hungry Giant!'

Reading Focus: I read so it sounds right and makes sense (read for meaning). I can segment the first few letters of a word and combine this with using the picture and the meaning of the story to help me solve the word (using the letter sounds and meaning, together to solve). The children are quickly learning to read the '20 Clay words'. These are practiced daily in both reading and writing. They are the most frequently read words in early readers and knowing these words helps the children in becoming fluent readers. Some children have already received the next 100 words to learn.

Writing Focus: I can write down the sounds I hear to make words.

The children will continue to practice writing by completing a variety of tasks; learning how to compose a message and then write this down, drawing pictures, labelling, lists and learning to write some high frequency words. We will continue our alphabet using THRASS picture cards, using cued articulation. We have introduced the THRASS consonant chart with the students and continue to look at the short vowels sounds; a,e,i,o,u. We have also discussed that the vowels can also say their name. Eg 'e' as in me and 'i' as in tiger.


Understand that punctuation is a feature of our writing and that these are different from letters. They will recognise how capital letters are used for names, and that a capital letter and full stops signal the beginning and end of a sentence.

Mathematics: Every Mathematics session incorporates counting and place value tasks. A game you might like to play with your child is; 'Highest or Lowest' card game. Rules - You have a partner. Divide the cards so each person has the same number of cards. Place your cards face down. One person turns over a card, says the number. The other person turns over a card, says the number. Whoever has the highest number takes the two cards. Repeat until all cards are gone. Winner is the person with the most cards. <u>Extension</u> - If your child can read a two-digit number, turn over 2 cards from 1-9 or if they can read a three-digit number, turn over 3 cards.

We hope all our beautiful Mum's, Grandma's and friends had a very special Mother's Day. I'm sure all our beautiful Year 1/2 children spoilt you all.

Cross Country

A big congratulations to all Foundation and Year 1/2 children for their participation in the Cross Country on Friday. We were so proud of you all and the way you cheered on all your friends. Thank you for being wonderful sportsman and woman.

Mass

This week 1/2 Bray and Newton will be heading to Mass on Friday at 12:05pm. All families are welcome.

Religious Education:

Last week we started looking at the unit 'Pentecost'. We will continue to introduce this unit. Students will revisit the story of *Stella Luna* and discuss how things will often make you worried or frightened, but these things will be overcome. Students will talk about things they were once scared of and how they overcome this. Did it get better as they got older or, did they do something else.

Literacy:

Each class will continue with their reading group rotations focusing on reading unfamiliar texts supported by their teacher and working on their fluency and comprehension. Students will work on developing their skills in breaking apart words and self-correction. In writing, each class is focusing on informational texts. Students will be exposed to a number of books that contain facts in order to help with their writing. Our spelling sounds this week is 'air' as in hair and 'are' as in square.

Numeracy:

This week we will continue on with our topic subtraction. Students will continue to develop a better understanding of the relationship addition and subtraction have. They will look at the concept of turnaround facts of addition and subtraction equations. For example, 23+34=57 the turnaround fact is 34+23=57 then using this fact students will know that 57-34=23 and 57-23=34. An activity that can be done at home is '**Real life subtraction equations**' - using catalogues and pictures from magazines/newspapers - students write and solve real life equations – e.g. I had \$20 and I bought 3 juices at \$5 each. How much did I spend? Students record equations in their maths book and solve e.g. 20-5-5-5= or 20-15 =.

Inquiry:

This week in Inquiry students will learn more about what materials can be recycled. They will be encouraged to discuss what they have noticed about the bins at school, in their community and at home. After looking at the symbols that represent reduce, reuse and recycle, the students will use these symbols to sort rubbish into the appropriate bins.

RRRR (Rights, resilience and respectful relationships) program:

Students explore what it feels like when they have to do something, they are afraid of and what everyday bravery looks like.

Students will be asked to think about the sorts of things in everyday life that can sometimes make children feel nervous or scared.

Students will then think up some ideas with a partner and share their ideas. Build a list.

Ask: What do you think 'being brave' is when you...

- Have to talk in front of assembly?
- Try new things?
- Get lost?
- Get left out?

YEAR THREE/FOUR – Karen, Nara, Ellie & Janina

It's Week 4 and our Year 3 students are now halfway through the NAPLAN testing period. We have been so proud of the positivity with which our students have approached the assessments. On Friday, following the last of the NAPLAN assessments, all of the Year 3/4 students will be treated to a performance of 'PAN' (the story of Peter Pan), which is being presented by students from Galen College. Please ensure that your child has returned their permission slip as we will not be able to take students for whom we have not obtained parental consent.

Literacy: We are continuing to explore Expository (Persuasive) texts during both Reading and Writing sessions this week. Through a variety of tasks, students are exploring persuasive devices such as rhetorical questions, modality, facts and statistics and emotive language, to support the construction of their own texts.

Spelling: Our phoneme/ grapheme focus this week is '-u, -o, -ou, -oo, and -oe' (as in 'bubble', 'money', 'enough', 'blood' and 'does').

Mathematics: This week students are developing their understanding of how to calculate elapsed time through a range of problem-solving tasks. Please continue to support and engage your child in time related activities at home (e.g. reading an analogue clock and then also expressing this in digital form; reading and interpreting a variety of timetables).

Homework: This week for homework, students are completing a 'calendar' task related to the month of May. They will be required to record each of the upcoming events on the calendar. Students are also reminded to read each evening and to record a summary of their reading (for one of the nights) in their Reading logs.

Religious Education: This week in our 'Sacraments of Initiation - Confirmation' unit, students learnt about the words and actions that are common to each of the Sacraments of Initiation - Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist. They also explored the order of the Confirmation ceremony, as well as the associated symbols and actions that are unique to each of these Sacraments.

Inquiry: This week, in our inquiry unit, 'The Blue Marble,' students created their own crosswords by developing a set of clues that were related to their glossary of sustainability words. They also labelled the major states and territories on a political map of Australia and they explored flight paths and the distances for different flights currently operating around Australia. Students also considered ways in which to reduce carbon emissions by changing transportation habits.

Students are also exploring decimals through a Reaction Time investigation and working on their soccer angles task.

Literacy:

This term the focus in Literacy will be persuasive texts also with a focus on Sustainability and information literacy. In reading, students will be exposed to a number of picture story books by Author Jackie French looking at natural disasters. Students will write a variety of non-fiction texts based on the natural events they have learned about, with a focus on using engaging vocabulary from the text to infer tone within their pieces.

Inquiry:

Our inquiry topic this term is **Think Global, Act Local.** The students have started exploring the weather and population patterns within Australia and examining events that have led to natural disasters. Classes are discussing ways in which governments manage resources to support affected communities.

Homework:

Homework will continue as set up in Term 1. Students will have a task on Seesaw to complete, a maths game and a mindfulness activity. It has been great to see students taking responsibility for their own learning and completing these homework tasks each week. Homework will be due each FRIDAY.

Social Media - Top Tips for Parents

- Talk to children about online privacy issues, making sure they know to never to identify personal information such as their full name, address, age, school and don't ever post photos in school uniform.
- Teach your children to respect people's privacy and don't share anyone else's personal information online without permission.
- Don't tag photos of your children at their school if your accounts are not set to completely private. This is a child safety issue as anyone driving past can search the school on Instagram and see all of the photos that have been tagged at the school, often by parents who have not set their account to private on Instagram. If your account is not completely private, anyone can see your photos of your child, their name, the name of the cat ,where you go on holiday, what your family does on weekends, when birthdays were and other information about your family and your life. Therefore a complete stranger could make up a story that could be very convincing to your child by using the information you have shared in a public forum of more than 500million users.
- If you are going to post anything with a significant fact, check it first.
- Teach your children to understand the importance of passwords, keeping them private and changing regularly.
- Learn how to recognise a scam. If it is too good to be true, it probably is.
- Make sure the apps you allow your kids to use are age appropriate.
- Don't be patronising or insulting to anyone. This kind of behaviour validates bad behaviour in children as they often see it if you are connected to young people on social media.

- Ban devices from the bedroom from as young as possible. Set boundaries around use.
- Share pictures and videos only with consent. And respect the privacy of others.
- Keep your love-life and arguments off social media.
- Stay positive. If you see something you disagree with don't engage.
- Consider the fact that children in the background of photos or videos you take at your child's school may be on "no publish" lists. Some children are in protective custody or witness protection and an innocent photo posted on social media could be disastrous.
- Teach young people not to say, or repeat anything that they wouldn't say if the person were standing right in front of them.
- Recognise that other people's opinions may be different to their own and that does not give them permission to attack those opinions online.
- Remember that even an emoji can be taken out of context by someone reading it.
- Use your head and your heart and don't let emotion be the only thing driving you to post.
- Make sure you respect classification on games, they are there for a reason.
- Make sure the young people in your care know that under no circumstances they should go and meet up with anyone they meet online. Stranger Danger rules apply because they are now literally on digital steroids and 24x7.
