## WHAT'S HAPPENING IN THE CLASSROOM

#### FOUNDATION – Caz & Trish

**Religion**: We visited St Patrick's and Our Lady's churches and looked at all the things inside the churches that were the same and what was different. We spoke about the parishioners of both the churches and how they might feel that they belong to these churches and what that means. Students will be making their own churches. <u>If you could send in any shoe boxes or boxes of any description, that would be amazing! Thank you so much.</u>

**Literacy:** This week's fairy-tale texts are - Foundation Levesque - 'The Ugly Duckling', Foundation Shaw - 'The Little Red Hen'. The students are looking at the originals of these stories and adaptations. They will be writing their own books about their fairy-tale and using their imaginations to change the story.

Blends (from big book) Levesque - str, ch, wh, sw, Shaw - wh, fl,

Mathematics: Students will revise capacity, length and mass through a variety of activities.

**Inquiry:** Students will continue the unit, 'Topsy Turvy Tales'. They will be asked to think creatively whilst using their imaginations. The children will be making their own puppet theatres and characters to tell a story. **If you have any odd socks lying around, they will be greatly appreciated to make puppets. Thank you.** 

**RRRR's**: Students will practice ways to seek help and inform a trusted adult if they or others they observe are treated inappropriately by others.

#### Literacy

This week, the students will revise the use of question marks in their writing, also looking at the words used to commence a question, ie: where, what, how etc.

The spelling for this week is 'st' as in 'stop' and 'ing' as in 'washing.'

Students also continue with their regular morning routine of reading; however, our supply of readers is dwindling. We ask you to PLEASE check for any readers you may have at home and return these to school. We have had some readers returned already and wish to thank those families who have taken the time to look for these.

#### Numeracy

In Mathematics this week, we are continuing the concept of Location and Transformation by incorporating our Inquiry unit and some Digital Technology! Through the use of the Ozobots and Bee-Bots, the students are experiencing the basics of coding by using directional language, commands, sequencing and problem-solving.

#### **Religious Education**

To round off our unit in 'Mission' the students will be locating photos and pictures in magazines that reflect people demonstrating good deeds for others, just as Jesus would have done. Students will then reflect on the question, 'How are the people in the pictures demonstrating love for each other?' Next week, we will commence our Advent unit, in the lead up to Christmas.

#### YEAR THREE/FOUR – James, Karen, Paul, Nara & Ellie

This week has taken off with a splash as we enjoy swimming at the Barr Reserve. As the weather heats up again it has been great to work on our swimming technique and remind ourselves of how to be safe around water.

#### **Religious Education:**

This is our final week of our unit, *Jesus Models Forgiveness*. We have further unpacked the four steps of reconciliation (admit responsibility, say sorry, receive forgiveness, make amends) by discovering how many popular stories and tales also demonstrate these four important steps.

Student's used Margaret Wild's picture book 'Miss Lily's Fabulous Pink Feather Boa' to create storyboards which order events in the story that demonstrate each step of reconciliation.

#### Inquiry & Literacy:

This week students have continued to refine their storyboards and transform them into dramatic play scripts for their 'frame by frame' inquiry projects. In preparation for filming, we have been exploring the use of stage directions, character actions and their dialogue as instructions for their play. Students have also worked with their inquiry groups to plan, create, build or source materials for their scenery, characters and props. If students would like to bring in items from home, we have asked them to check with parents before bringing in (named) items. Over the next few weeks we will continue to refine our scripts and collect materials, ready for capturing images to use in the creation of our stop motion films using the 'iMotion animation' application.

*Spelling focus:* Plurals: change words ending in '\_f/fe' to '\_ves' e.g. knife - knives Plurals: change in the basic spelling to form plurals e.g. mouse – mice

#### Numeracy:

This week in Numeracy we have looked at representing fractions on number lines. Students are discovering how number lines can help us to decide whether a fraction is bigger, smaller or equivalent to another. We have been investigating 'Equivalent Fractions', which can be defined as fractions with different numerators and denominators that represent the same value or proportion of the whole. For example, 2/4 and 4/8 are equivalent fractions as they are the same proportion of a whole - 1/2. To allow students to prove their identified equivalent fractions, we have been cutting paper shapes of the same size into different fractions, to see how different fraction amounts can fit together into the same shape.

#### Uniform:

Please ensure that students come to school in the correct school uniform, including appropriate footwear and correct coloured socks (<u>not black</u>). We do understand that there will be times when children have outgrown footwear and that this is an expensive uniform item. If your child is required to be 'out of uniform' for some reason, please advise Mr Corrigan and your child's teacher. This can be done with a note or a phone call. Thank you for your understanding.

#### **Curriculum News**:

**Numeracy Focus** - This week we are continuing to build upon the knowledge gained about calculating volume last week by using nets of shapes to create 3D objects. Students will also be investigating capacity and angles over the next fortnight.

**Robotics -** The Year 6 students had a great experience at GoTafe Innovation Hub building and coding their robots. Our Expo will be Thursday the 21st November at 3.00pm.

**Reading Focus -** Students will continue to investigate the Jackie French natural disaster series to make comparisons and analyse French's style. Over the next four weeks, students will explore the picture story books and critically analyse vocabulary choice, intended tone and how French has used research knowledge of historical content to create the fictional texts. They will also explore the symbolism of Bruce Whatley's illustrative techniques during class and Art time.







**Writing Focus -** Students will use techniques learnt during reading sessions and experiment within their own historical narrative writing.

**Inquiry -** The students are working busily on their Bizarre Bazaar unit, as they gain a real-life understanding of the design and production process when creating a brand for a new product. They will produce and sell their products at the **Bizarre Bazaar Market on the 28th of November at 2:30pm**. Parents and friends are welcome to come in and support the market! We will be aiming to use as much recycled materials as we can. All proceeds go to Unicef Australia. The students are looking for the following, if families have these could they drop them into the 5/6 area:

- 1. Fishnet Stockings
- 2. Small cylinder-shaped Containers (like camera cartridges)
- 3. Small plastic rectangle containers
- 4. Elastic
