FOUNDATION - Caz & Trish

Well here is week six! The weeks are flying!

Next Monday, 18th November, the students will be going on an excursion to Our Lady's Church.

Christmas Concert - Wednesday, 4th December

Just an early notice - Foundation students will be performing as angels at the concert and therefore will be asked to wear something red, green or white. This does not have to be purchased especially. If you have something in one or all of these colours to add to their evening outfits, that would be fantastic. Golden halos will be provided for them at school. Any queries, please ask Carolyn or Trish.

Religion: We continue the unit, 'Our Church'. The students will begin to develop an understanding of Church as a welcoming and caring community that gathers to celebrate. The students have been sharing and drawing responses to different groups they belong to. We will be visiting St Patrick's and Our Lady's churches next week to look at what you will find in a church.

Literacy: This week's fairy-tale texts are - Foundation Levesque - 'The Gingerbread Man' Foundation Shaw - 'The Three Billy Goats Gruff.'

Students will investigate the texts, they will rhyme, find syllables, antonyms, synonyms from the words in the text. They will discuss the problem and resolution in the story. This week you and your child could find some interesting words and find some synonyms (other words that mean the same) e.g. tired, exhausted. The students are also practising their own 'Reader's Theatre'. They are assigning each other parts to play and learning to read their roles with intonation and creativity.

Mathematics: Students will be exploring money and revising pattern, subtraction and addition.

Inquiry: Students will continue the unit, 'Topsy Turvy Tales'. They will practice using their imagination whilst pretending to be a fairy-tale character.

RRRR's: Students will recognise types of gender-based violence and practice responding assertively to gender-based violence.

Welcome to week six!

Thanks to those who attended the twilight sports last week. Despite the windy weather, a good time was had by all the students and it was great to see them conducting themselves with great sportsmanship. Thanks for coming along and showing your support.

Literacy

This week, the students will focus on revising the use of commas in their writing, primarily for pauses and when separating items in a series. The spelling for this week is 'ould' as in 'could' and 'sp' as in 'spin.'

Students also continue with their regular morning routine of reading; however, our supply of readers is dwindling. We ask you to PLEASE check for any readers you may have at home and return these to school. Thanking you in anticipation.

Numeracy

In Mathematics this week, we are revisiting the concept of Location and Transformation by incorporating our Inquiry unit and some Digital Technology! Through the use of the Ozobots and Bee-Bots, the students are experiencing the basics of coding by using directional language, commands, sequencing and problem-solving.

Religious Education

As we near Christmas, we will begin finishing off our unit, 'Loving God and Others – Our call to Mission' in preparation for our Advent unit. This week, the students will design posters entitled, 'Christian Mission is to Love'. They will include key words and illustrations to depict the notion of Christian Mission, and what we, as a school, can do to help those less fortunate.

Religious Education:

The 3/4 classes are continuing to work through the unit, *Jesus Models Forgiveness*. This week, we are reading, discussing and writing about how the four steps of reconciliation (admit responsibility, say sorry, receive forgiveness, make amends) relate to our own lives. To further the children's learning experiences, they will match the story of the Prodigal Son with the four steps or Reconciliation.

Inquiry & Literacy:

This week students are working in groups and continuing the process of converting a picture story book into a play. It involves deconstructing the group's chosen story and making sure that they have noted all of the important details that they will need to include in their play (setting the scene, characters, problem(s), resolution(s) and how the story ends). The classes are also looking at what a prologue is and who gives this information to the audience. After reading, talking and modelling some examples of prologues, each child in the group will write a prologue for their play and read it to their team.

Spelling focus: Plurals: vowel followed by '_y', add '_ s' e.g. journey - journeys

Plurals: change in the basic spelling to form plurals e.g. mouse – mice

Numeracy:

This week in Numeracy we continue with the new unit, 'Fractions'. Students are developing their understanding of the different parts of a 'proper' fraction - the numerator, the fraction bar and the denominator. They are connecting fractions with - visual picture representation, drawing images to represent given fractions and equal parts. To reinforce these concepts the children are working with a variety of concrete materials and activities – playdough, paper squares/shapes, counters and blocks, name and word fractions.

Uniform:

Please ensure that students come to school in the correct school uniform, including appropriate footwear and correct coloured socks (<u>not black</u>). We do understand that there will be times when children have outgrown footwear and that this is an expensive uniform item. If your child is required to be 'out of uniform' for some reason, please advise Mr Corrigan and your child's teacher. This can be done with a note or a phone call. Thank you for your understanding.

Curriculum News:

Numeracy Focus - This week we are continuing to build upon the knowledge gained about calculating volume last week by using nets of shapes to create 3D objects. Students will also be investigating capacity and angles over the next fortnight.

Robotics - The Year 6 students had a great first session at GoTafe last week. Each student had programming sessions in the Computer Lab together with a session in the Innovation Hub. Our next visit is TODAY Wednesday 13th November. Our Expo will be scheduled sometime next week.

Reading Focus - Students will continue to investigate the Jackie French natural disaster series to make comparisons and analyse French's style. Over the next four weeks, students will explore the picture story books and critically analyse vocabulary choice, intended tone and how French has used research knowledge of historical content to create the fictional texts. They will also explore the symbolism of Bruce Whatley's illustrative techniques during class and Art time.









Writing Focus - Students will use techniques learnt during reading sessions and experiment within their own historical narrative writing.

Inquiry - In the Bizarre Bazaar unit, students will gain a real-life understanding of the design and production process when creating a brand for a new product. They will produce and sell a product at the **Bizarre Bazaar Market** later this term. We will be aiming to use as much recycled materials as we can. The students are looking for the following if families have these could they drop them into the 5/6 area:

- 1. Fishnet Stockings
- 2. Small cylinder-shaped Containers (like camera cartridges)
- 3. Small plastic rectangle containers
- 4. Elastic
- 5. Fabric of any type

RE - Students explore the enduring questions 'Why do we have Sacraments?' and 'How can the Sacraments influence my life?'. You might like to discuss Sacraments with your child at home.

RRRR'S - This term we will be exploring positive gender relations.

Treasurer's report: Carried over to the next meeting

GENERAL BUSINESS:

• **Playground beautification** (Katie Pallot). Katie outlined the work done by the AG&T students regarding the children's preferences for the Ovens St yard. Some changes have already been made (re: a carpeted sitting area and outdoor games storage area near science room). Children have spent considerable time observing current usage and talking with staff and students.

Tan bark area in front of the hall – create a sandpit with raised seating to hold the sand in. It has natural shade.

Biodiversity in the school is important. The students have shown a preference to play with natural things (eg. Sand, tan bark etc)

Big yard – looking to develop a vertical garden along high fence line (near Mr Kelly's house) Katie has an extensive file on student findings and design ideas which Terry will send to the group.
