FEAST OF THE ASSUMPTION

Celebrated each year on August 15, the Feast of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary commemorates the death of Mary and her bodily assumption into Heaven. Because it signifies the Blessed Virgin's passing into eternal life, it is the most important of all Marian feasts and a Holy Day of Obligation.

The Feast of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary is also known The Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary, The Assumption of Mary Into Heaven, The Dormition of the Theotokos and The Falling Asleep of the Blessed Virgin Mary.

The Feast of the Assumption is a very old feast of the Church, celebrated universally by the sixth century. The feast was originally celebrated in the East, where it is known as the Feast of the Dormition, a word which means "the falling asleep". The earliest printed reference to the belief that Mary's body was assumed into Heaven dates from the fourth century, in a document entitled "The Falling Asleep of the Holy Mother of God". The document is written in the voice of the Apostle John, to whom Christ on the Cross had entrusted the care of His mother, and recounts the death, laying in the tomb, and assumption of the Blessed Virgin. Attendance

St Pat's has always monitored student attendance and responded where appropriate to inform parents when attendances drop to an unacceptable level. There is now an expectation from educational authorities that students will achieve a 95% attendance rate. Schools will now be required to contact parents when student attendance drops below this figure. Clearly, families contact schools when their child is away, and this often is enough to avoid a contact call. The focus is on absences from school with no known reason.

Parents are reminded to contact school if their child is away for any reason. This avoids a phone call from the office seeking clarification as to why the child is absent. We do this to ensure safety of the students in our care, in case something has happened on their way to school.

Parents are asked to contact school as we need confirmation from an adult. A student reporting a sibling's absence for the day is not acceptable. Please contact me if you require clarification.

School Uniform

We constantly monitor school uniform and, occasionally, some students fall below an acceptable standard. If your child is not wearing the correct uniform, can you please send a note to your child's teacher. This means that the issue has been dealt with and no further action will be taken. It also tells us that there is a legitimate reason for the lack of uniform and not a student deciding what they want to wear. Thank you for your understanding.

CHATTER MATTERS

Pragmatics and Social skills

Focus: self-awareness - identifying personal strengths and skill sets,

Encourage each member of the household to develop an "**About Me**" book or card to share with each other. This could be on a computer, Ipad or a scrapbook hard copy. Include information on their personal, family and friendship details, likes/dislikes, strengths (what they're good at), challenges or what they'd like to be good at. Really you can include any information that's important to you and your child.

Make sure you include pictures and/or photos.

Go through this book on a weekly basis update the details and comment or ask each other questions such as; Why do you like.....? How are you going with this challenge? It's great for your child to see that everyone has challenges and are working hard to improve themselves.

If you don't have time to make an About Me book, go through the family photo album regularly with your child. Talk about what they were doing in the photo, what they were thinking, feeling. Focus on something in the photo that demonstrates your child's skills eg; making a sandcastle, painting a picture, going down a slide. Would they like to do it again, why?

Welcome to Week 5

This week, we welcomed back Mr Capper. We have enjoyed hearing all about his overseas adventures.

Our learning focus for the week -

Religion - We continue with our unit 'We can pray in different ways'. The students will continue to create their own prayers of praise, thanks and petition. We will also recite formal Catholic prayers such as 'Our Father' and look at what the words of the prayer mean to us today. Last week, the students participated in a Mary MacKillop liturgy, with the focus on her special motto - 'Never see a need without doing something about it'. You might like to ask your child what this motto means to them.

Literacy - our spelling topics this week, are 'j as in jug' and 'scr as in scrap'. We will continue to use our readers and class stories to find the many uses for commas. Commas will also be a focus that we will encourage the students to use in their own writing. This week, we will also explore 'adverbs' and their use. We will continue to explore the many forms of poetry and provide further opportunities for the students to compose their own. Our class stories continue with the focus on 'multiculturalism' and accepting differences in cultures within Australia and around the world.

<u>Mathematics</u> - we will focus on 'Multiplication' and 'Skip counting' through various games and practical situations. Students will be encouraged to develop confidence with number sequences to and from 100 with different skip counting sequences. They will also explore 'Multiplication' by recognising and representing this through repeated addition, groups and arrays.

Inquiry - we continue with our unit 'Celebrate Differences' in our world. This week, we will continue to explore our Indigenous Culture by looking at where we see the art, hear the acknowledgment of country and listen to 'Dreamtime Stories'.

School Camp: It is vital that all permission notes and medical forms be returned as soon as possible as this allows adequate time for staff to plan the camp. Any parents wishing to go into the ballot as 'camp helpers' are also asked to return the 'expression of interest' by this Friday 16th August. This will allow the selected parents to make plans with their respective employers. If your child requires medication on school camp, please see Mrs Newton for a medical form to fill out. All medications are to be given to the child's teacher on the day of camp, with the form filled out. This also includes travel sickness medication. **Please do not leave any medication in your child's possession.**

Religion: This week the students continue reflecting and sharing their understandings about what it means to be a follower of Jesus. They are listening to, reading and interpreting Gospel stories and parables through a variety of activities. One gospel story that the students will revisit is 'The Good Shepherd'. Students will be asked to reflect on the story and why 'The Shepherd' was a follower of Jesus.

Literacy & Inquiry: This week students will be looking at writing a biography of a well-known person. Students were given the opportunity to research Roald Dahl, Ash Barty and Leonardo Da Vinci. Students were given a scaffold template that focused on biographical facts including birth/place of birth/death then looking at a series of events in their life.

During Writing sessions this week and in conjunction with the Inquiry unit, 'Someone Else's Shoes', students will brainstorm a list of well-known people/person with a disability. Some classes may have already organised their list and students may have picked their person of interest.

Spelling focus: _ie as in magpie.

Numeracy: Over the next four weeks the students will be investigating the relationship between multiplication and division facts and using them to problem solve. Last week students developed their understanding of arrays and they observed 'turnaround' facts for multiplication. These 'turnaround' facts include 6x3= 18 and 3x6= 18. Students are using these facts to assist with developing their understanding of their equations: eg. 183=6. Students have used concrete materials to assist them with this process or to double check their answers.

Uniform: Please ensure that students come to school in correct school uniform, including appropriate footwear. We do understand that there will be times when children have outgrown footwear and that this is an expensive uniform item. If your child is required to be 'out of uniform' for some reason, please advise Mr Corrigan and your child's teacher. This can be done with a note or a phone call. Thank you for your understanding.

Curriculum News:

Ablaze - Students will attend the Ablaze concert in Wodonga. A rock concert organised by the Sandhurst Diocese and hosted by Fr Rob Galea. This is the first time Primary Schools have been involved in the initiative, so we are looking forward to the day of music, dancing and fun.

Numeracy Focus - Students continue to apply their understanding of the BAR Model to solving multi-step problems that involve fractions and all four processes. We are working with Base 10 blocks and counters to further consolidate understanding of fraction concepts.

Reading Focus - Students continue to develop reading skills through Literacy Circles and are beginning our Poetry unit.

Writing - To key into our reading focus the students will embark on developing their own Slam Poetry pieces.

Inquiry - Students have selected a 'problem' they would like to further explore from the list of 'sanitation, poverty, illiteracy and malnutrition'. They have created an 'infographic' to present some information and will begin thinking about how they are going to persuade and inform an audience about the problem.

RE - We will begin our Life Relationships unit over the next week.

Radio - Tahlia and Hannah from 5/6 O'Connor, will be presenting the St Patrick's Radio Hour on Thursday from 2:00pm on Oak FM.

RRRR'S - This term we exploring issues relating to Gender and Identity.

TIMELINE

Friday 21st June - Accept the offer of a position at Galen Catholic College for 2020 by returning the letter along with payment of \$200 to secure your place.

Wednesday 28th August – <u>Year 7 2020 Testing Day</u>

This is NOT an entrance test. Your son/daughter's enrolment with us has been finalised once you accept the position and pay the deposit.

The purpose of the assessment is to provide us with information about your son/daughter's skills in language and mathematics. It assists us in identifying possible areas of need for extension or assistance. This helps us provide a suitable curriculum for our students.

A report summarising your son/daughter's performance in the assessment tasks will be forwarded to you in due course.

Children will need to bring a snack for recess and may also bring bottled water, which they can have with them in the room.

Please have your child wear their normal Primary school uniform to the testing day.

Children are to meet in the Max Fletcher Auditorium no later than 8:20am to allow time for check in and preparation for testing. Parents will need to sign children in.

There will be a break between the tests at which time the children can enjoy recess with the Year 7 and 8 students at Galen.

Pick up will be from the Auditorium at 12:45pm. Parents or a representative will need to sign their child out of the Auditorium upon pickup.

Thursday 7th November – Year 7 2019 Parent Information Night

Parents are invited to attend the parent information night to find out about expectations around uniform, homework and our transition program. This will be held in the Max Fletcher Auditorium. Children do not need to attend, as they will have their own transition days.

Thursday 7th November – <u>Transition Day – Non CREW schools</u>

Non CREW Schools (Students attending Galen from all Primary Schools other than St Bernard's, St Patrick's and Our Lady's)

Friday 8th November – <u>Transition Day – CREW schools</u>

CREW Schools (Students attending Galen from St Bernard's, St Patrick's and Our Lady's)

Children are invited to attend a day at Galen to begin the transition from Primary to Secondary school. Children will be supervised by Galen College staff and will be involved in a number of activities for the day. Students should bring recess and lunch for the day. The school canteen will also be open. Transition day is for a full day, first bell 8.45am, final bell 3.29pm. Students are required to wear their current shool uniform.

Tuesday 10th December – Orientation Day

Children will find out who is in their homeroom and who their homeroom teacher will be. They will start the process of getting to know their new classmates and hear about the expectations of them when they start Year 7 next year. Students should bring recess and lunch for the day. After the general introductions children will experience a day in the life of a Galen student by taking part in a number of different classes.
