I watched and prayed over the holidays for the Thai soccer team that became trapped in the caves at Chang Rai. My initial thoughts were concern for the children and how their coach could be silly enough to lead them into such a dangerous environment.

That opinion waned over time to just be concerned for all involved. The death of the Thai Navy Seal was a tragedy in itself. There were many people who, over the time, put themselves in harm's way to save these children.

In a funny way, it gave me a glimpse of what is possible in a world that can, at times, seem fractured and broken (and not just of Trump's and Putin's doing either – although they don't help!). This event brought together a great number of people from across the world for a single and unified purpose.

To see so many risk their lives for the sake of others is inspiring and it speaks to me of God at work in our world. Of coming together out of respect and love of life. It doesn't matter to me what their faith backgrounds are (or if they had one at all).

It showed me a world that, for a short period of time, became unified in a common and loving cause.

## School Closure – Tuesday 24<sup>th</sup> July

St Pat's will be closed next TUESDAY, 24<sup>th</sup> July, to allow staff to work with Dr Duncan Symons Lecturer in Science and Mathematics Education Melbourne Graduate School of Education (Melbourne University). Duncan will work with staff on "Inquiry based mathematics and resolution" as well as "Using Codable robots for Critical Thinking/algorithmic thinking in mathematics".



## Playground Update

The process has now been completed. The School Board supported the P&F Playground Committee's suggestions as to the course of action to be taken.

To this end, I have ordered new playground equipment for the school. It has a build time of 8 to 10 weeks and an installation time of 6 to 10 days. It is anticipated that it will be completed by the end of term three (all going to plan). Cost of this project is \$116,000 the bulk of which is being funded by funds raised by the Parents and Friends Association. The remainder will be met by the school with money set aside for capital improvements.

## Football in the playground

Some weeks ago, staff elected to trial a footy timetable to allow students more space to play football. However, this then restricted the access the students had to playing football. Commencing tomorrow, Thursday, we are going back to the original playground routine.

Each area of the school will have an area marked out for their access to having a kick or playing "markers up" etc. There will remain in place a "no tackle" rule at school so as to keep our children as safe as possible. I am happy to field any questions or queries regarding this or any other element of school life.

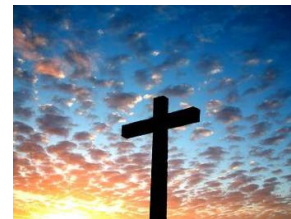

## CHATTER MATTERS

Giving and listening to instructions;

One of the most rewarding learning experiences you can have with your child is while playing board or table top games. At least once week ask your child to drag out an old game. Pretend that you've forgotten how to play the game and encourage your child to give you the instructions. Make sure you follow their instructions exactly as they say them, even if they are wrong. This way the child will realise they haven't given clear instructions and will need to adjust their language accordingly.

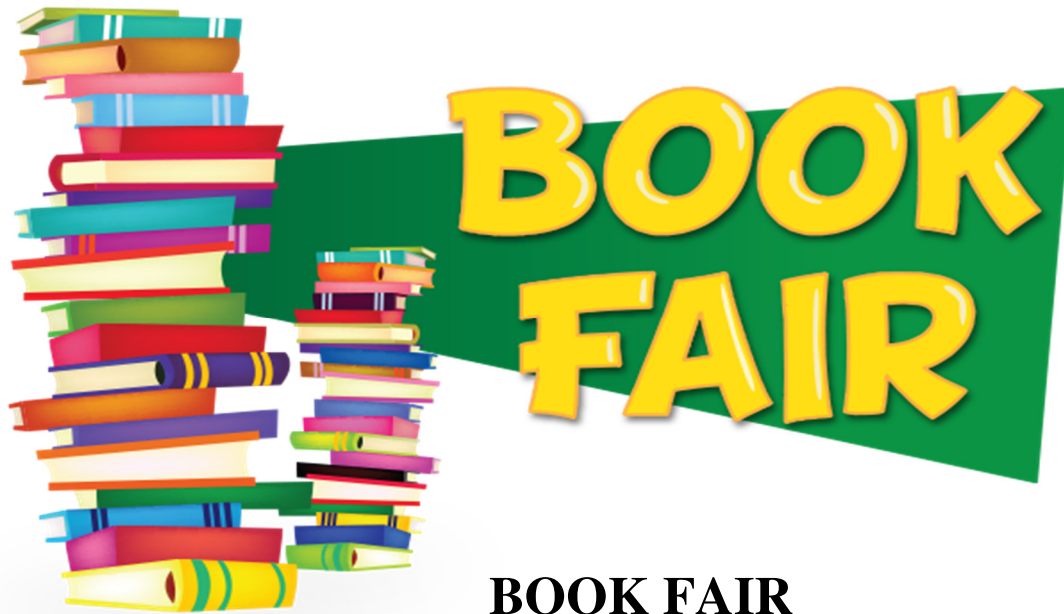


## MAKE A DIFFERENCE IN THE LIFE OF A CHILD

Welcome back!!! We hope your children had a restful break over the holidays and that you were able to manage some quality time together as families. We have been told of many wonderful adventures from some of our students!!

This semester we begin a new rotation of specialist classes for the year one and two students. The students will now attend Science classes (in place of Art) and begin Italian lessons until the end of the year. We are sure the students will have much to tell you upon the commencement of these subjects.

As always, we remind parents to continue labelling jumpers, containers and drink bottles to lessen the amount of unclaimed items. We thank you for your support with this matter.

### **Literacy**

For both Year 1 and Year 2 students this week, there has been much to write about holidays and special highlights. The students have given recounts of the holidays, focusing on sequencing their events as well as paragraphing to separate their ideas.

In addition, Year 1 students have continued to focus on the structure of narrative texts, whilst the Year 2 students have focused on the skills necessary to edit their own written pieces.

In spelling, the Year 1 students are looking at 'all' as in 'tall'. The Year 2 students are looking at the 'sl' blend as in 'sleep'.

### **Numeracy**

In Year 1 this week, the students are exploring the difference between using counting up and counting back strategies. We have been using concrete materials such as unifix to explore the difference between two quantities.

In Year 2, the students are becoming familiar with the order of multiplication and being able to recognise and represent multiplication as repeated addition, groups and arrays. Students have begun using counters and other materials to model arrays and organise groups, to consolidate the concept of multiplication. Students are having lots of hands-on experience to help them articulate how they've organised their counters into groups and arrays.

### **Inquiry**

Our new unit, 'Through Generations', will be the focus for term three. Throughout the unit, students will learn the importance of connections – particularly those with family and past generations. Students will use their knowledge about what has changed and what has stayed the same, in order to prepare for their future. Discussions will include family structures, places of cultural or spiritual importance and the lives of people in the past. As part of the unit, students will participate in an excursion to the Wangaratta Multicultural Society on Thursday 2<sup>nd</sup> August, to enhance their learning in this area. Permission notes have been sent home for this excursion.

## **Religious Education**

We begin the term with our new unit, 'What is Baptism?' The students have begun looking at Baptism as a Sacrament and the symbols associated with the ceremony. Students have reflected on their experience of Baptism, be it their own or someone else's. We encourage conversation around this topic at home, if parents feel comfortable to reflect or impart their wisdom!

## **YEAR THREE/FOUR – Sarah, James & Karen**

Welcome back to all our Year 3/4 families! We hope your break was relaxing and the children are ready and raring to go for Term 3. It's going to be a busy one!

Also, a special welcome to Hamish Kilby, who has started in 3/4 Rizzo this term.

### **Some dates to remember:**

### **Religion:**

This term the students will look at two units – 'Followers of Jesus' and 'Community of Believers'. In 'Followers of Jesus' the students will reflect on Jesus and his call to love others through words and actions. In 'Community of Believers' the students will be invited to discover ways in which they can contribute to the Church through actions of unity and justice. This week the students will create a KWL chart of what they know about Jesus.

### **Literacy:**

This term our focus in Literacy is Informational Report text. Students will be discussing, reading, planning and writing information reports on different topics. This week, the students are brainstorming and listing the different parts of an informational report text, then reading, discussing and analysing the different parts of an information report on 'Kangaroos'. Through modelling by the teacher and reading different types of medium, students will learn how to plan their ideas and write an information report.

Our spelling focus this week is on plurals. Rule: Add 's' to most nouns to make them plural e.g. chair – chairs; pencil - pencils

Even though there is no homework this week, please ensure your child reads every night and fills in his/her reading log.

### **Numeracy:**

This week the students are exploring the unit, 'Chance' and the everyday language we use when talking about Chance. Through games, such as 'Heads or Tails' and 'Guess the Colour', and activities such as 'Dice Roll', the students are identifying and describing possible outcomes and recognising variations in their results. The students are also looking at everyday events and ordering the chances of it occurring.

### **Inquiry:**

This term's unit, "First Contact", looks at the lives of the First Australians before European settlers arrived in Australia and the causes and reasons for the journey of the First Fleet. The students will practise thinking and acting like historians as they are immersed in stories of first contact between Indigenous Australians and European Settlers.

## YEAR FIVE/SIX – Nara, Paul, Andrea, Helen, Sharyn & Catherine

### **Literacy**

Given that last week was NAIDOC Week, during Reading sessions this week students are exploring a variety of text types from the Yarning Strong Anthology. This is an Indigenous resource comprised of four anthologies which are related to 'Land, Law, Family and Identity'. Following on from whole group reading sessions, the students are working on creating posters, depicting family trees and also recording written responses to text. During focus groups the students have had the opportunity to develop their understanding of Reader's Theatre and how to use their voice to effectively convey the characters in a story. In their Literature Circles they have been introduced to a short novel, once again relating to one of the anthologies. They will be focusing on connecting to concepts in the text, either making a *text to text*, *text to self* or *text to world* connection.

In Writing sessions this week, the students are reflecting on the significance of NAIDOC Week and this year's theme, ***Because of her, we can!*** They have been listening and responding to the *Behind the News* video related to NAIDOC Indigenous Women. This focuses on the contribution of significant Indigenous women to Australia's history, beginning with a Tasmanian Aboriginal named Truganini, who was instrumental attempting to protect her people against the injustices that were occurring during the initial European settlement in Australia. The students have also had an opportunity to become familiar with Indigenous women such as Cathy Freeman, Lowitja O'Donoghue, Evonne Goolagong Cawley, Jessica Mauboy and Christine Anu who have contributed to Australia in many different ways.

### **Numeracy:**

In Numeracy this week, we are focusing on the concept of Division. Students are developing their understanding of divisibility strategies which will also involve practical, real-life applications. Following this they will move on to furthering their understanding of written division strategies.

*Please remember that Maths doesn't just occur in the classroom. Encourage your child to take part in real life experiences at home such as **shopping** (addition and subtraction of money), **cooking** (weighing, measuring, fractions), **measuring** (heights, lengths, distances) and **telling time** (both analogue and digital; reading timetables; calculating elapsed time/ time durations) and measurement.*

### **AFL 9's:**

This term Galen VET Sport and Recreation students will once again conduct AFL9's Clinics for the Year 5 and 6 classes. This will conclude with a carnival where St Pat's students will play the other CREW primary schools. The dates are as follows:

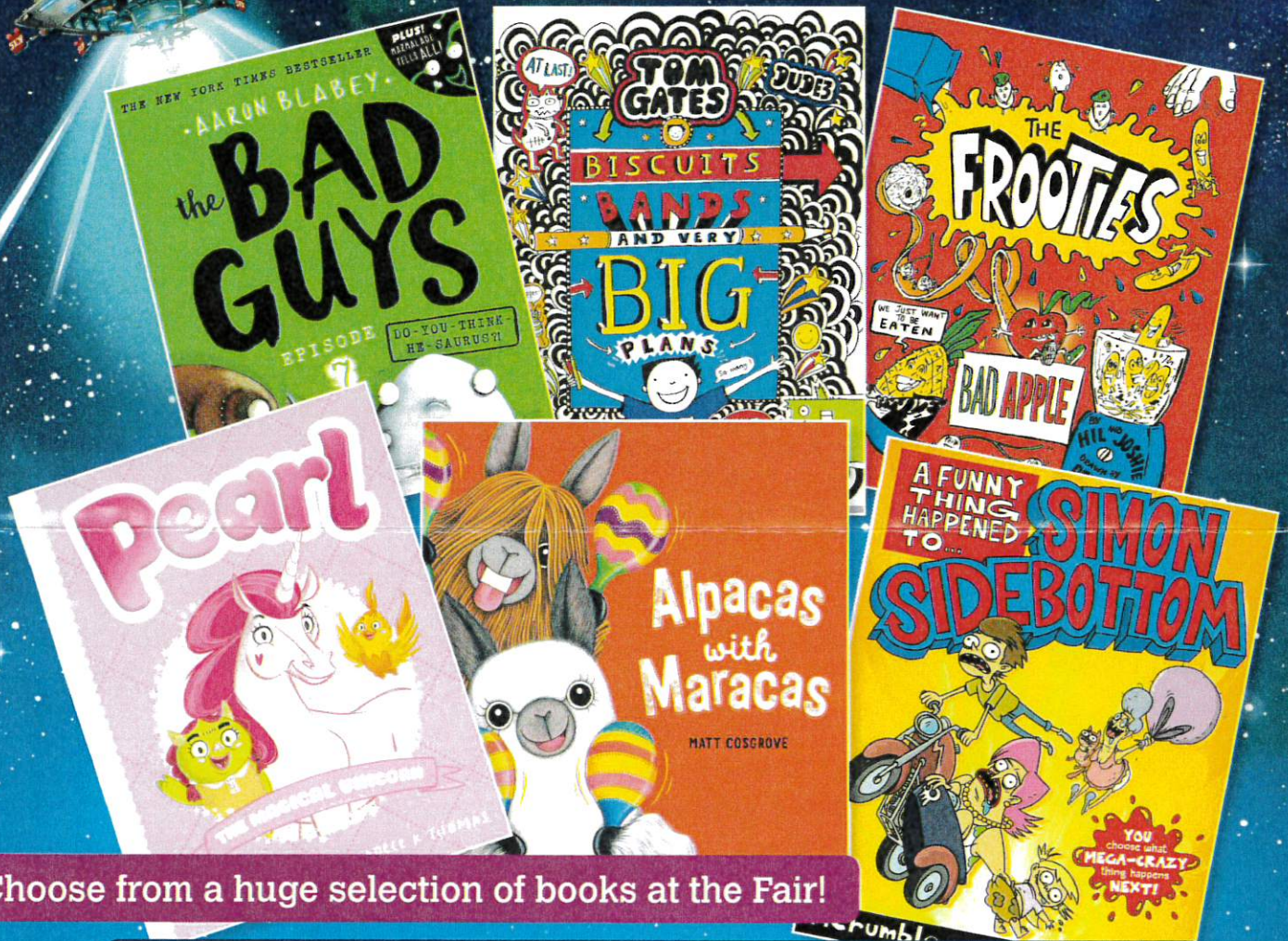
