WHAT'S HAPPENING IN THE CLASSROOM

FOUNDATION - Caz & Trish

Welcome to week 8. Yesterday we celebrated St Patrick's Day, our school's Patron Saint. We celebrated as a whole school gathering for a liturgy and sharing cake.

Religion: We will finish our unit, 'What do we know about Jesus?' by continuing to read stories about Jesus. Next week will begin the Holy Week Story, in preparation for Easter.

Literacy: Big Books – Levesque - 'Dan the Flying Man,' Shaw - 'Brown Bear, Brown Bear'. The students will continue to enjoy listening and reading the big books each day. The students will focus on looking at the pictures and the starting letter to help them read. The students will continue to rhyme and use syllables. During writing, the students will continue to 'write' and draw a message for others to read. They will focus on, 'I can write down what I hear,' and 'I need spaces between words when I write a sentence.'

Reader bags: These are to come to school every day. In this bag there is often important notes or messages as well.

Mathematics: Our topic is 'Subitise'. Subitise is when we look at a collection and know how many are in it without counting. This is an important skill for students to have. Students who play many board games with a di can subitise really well. What board game will you play this week?

Inquiry: The students will construct a bridge in class, they will determine how and what materials they will use to build it. We are sad to inform you that after much consideration the intended excursion to visit the bridges has been cancelled. Due to the coronavirus it has been recommended that we do not take the children outside the school grounds as a group. Thank you for your cooperation on this matter.

4R's - *Emotional Literacy -* Students will recognise the kinds of experiences that may trigger particular emotions.

Welcome to Week 8

It is hard to believe how quick this term has flown. We should all be proud of the wonderful achievements of the students.

Yesterday, it was wonderful for our school community to celebrate St Patrick's Day in style with our clothes of green and of course, the famous giant cake.

To assist us with the care of your children, we ask that you please go through the office with any late arrivals or early dismissals. This ensures the correct procedures are put in place.

This week's learning focus -

Religion - we continue our Lenten journey with the focus on helping others, sharing, being brave, thanking others and being thankful and praying. Through random acts of kindness at home and at school, we can show how easy it is to follow in the 'footsteps of Jesus'.

We will also listen to the stories of Holy Week and prepare for our Stations of the Cross which are happening next week.

Easter egg raffle - thank you for your donation of Easter eggs for our raffle. If you require more tickets, please see the office. This is a great way for our school community to raise further money for Caritas. Did you know even a small amount such as \$1 can play an important part in buying 2 notebooks for a child so they can attend school in Cambodia.

Literacy - we will look at the spelling patterns involving the long 'ee' sound as in 'meet and seen'. Through brainstorming and spelling activities, the students will explore ways of recognising this sound in words. Through handwriting sessions, the students will continue to focus on correct pencil grip and body posture.

We continue to focus on writing recounts and narratives. Using picture story books and digital resources, the students are encouraged to see the important features of these texts. They are then encouraged to create their own texts using tools such as the 'Colourful Semantics' - which include who, what doing, how doing, where, when and why.

Mathematics - through a variety of activities, the students will be encouraged to further their understanding of 'Number and Place Value'. Using games such as 'What's in my number?', the students are asked to name numbers that are more/less than their number and name values in the number they have chosen. The students will focus on recognising, modelling, reading and writing numbers. We will also have the focus of 'Subtracting in your head' through the exploration of choosing appropriate mental strategies such as making 10 and counting back. We encourage the students to use their existing knowledge such as friends of 10 and doubles to solve new mathematical equations.

Religious Education:

This week we celebrated Saint Patrick's Day. In class students learnt about Saint Patrick's achievements in Ireland and how he used the shamrock to explain the Holy Trinity. This week is

also, the fourth week of this year's Lenten Journey towards Easter. For Caritas Australia's project compassion this week, our students will learn about the story of Sakun, a Gond Indigenous woman living in a village in central-east India. Sakun developed polio as a child and has difficulty walking. Caritas Australia helped fund a program which provided strategic guidance and support to Sakun, helping her to learn new skills and gain important mobility. Sakun now earns her own income and makes a small profit which goes towards her family's basic needs. Thanks to Caritas, Sakun is more resilient, more confident and more independent.

Literacy:

In **Reading** this week, we are practicing maintaining fluency while reading through a focus on punctuation in texts. We will be looking for full stops, quotation marks, commas and exclamation marks in writing and aiming to reflect these with our voice through intonation and pausing. Pausing and taking strategic breaths while reading, can calm our voices and allow us to read words smoothly, improving our ability to read with fluency.

In **Writing** this week, students are completing their multiple choice questions or statements in their online quizzes related to our Inquiry study of 'Forces and Functions. Students are also composing their independent persuasive texts on different topics.

Spelling Focus: **ore** *as in* **store** *and* **more**. We are also looking at other graphemes which create the **or** sound, such as, **aw** in **saw**, **or** in **stork** and **au** in **sauce**.

Homework:

This week the students have tasks related to Reading, Spelling and Mathematics. Please support your child to complete each component of the homework and fill in their reading log in their homework book (including a comment). The Spelling task involves creating a word ladder using spelling words which feature different graphemes for the 'or' sound. For Maths, students are asked to write a set of numbers in expanded notation, such as 345=300+40+5 and teach/play the game, 'Wipeout' with a family member. As the students are learning a variety of maths games and activities each week, we encourage them to keep playing them at home. Homework is due back this **Friday the 20th March**.

Mathematics:

This week we are finishing our focus unit on Place Value in Numeracy. Throughout this unit students have learnt how to read, write, represent, order, rename and partition numbers up to and above the ten thousand place value. Next week we will be starting a new unit on Time. Students will learn about reading the time from digital and analogue clocks and making sense of time related data and information.

Inquiry:

During Technology sessions in school, students have created interactive online quizzes on a website called Scratch. This week students will be finalising their quizzes and creating links to share their work on seesaw. Stay tuned for a link to these quizzes for you to try at home.

4Rs (Resilience, Rights and Respectful Relationships)

This week in our Thursday rotations, students are learning about positive peer support by exploring factors that contribute to positive and negative relationships with fellow students. Students are identifying ways they can positively influence other's emotions and identify peer support strategies for the classroom and the playground.

Student's School Day Absences, Late Arrivals & Early Departures

We would like to remind families of procedures regarding student's school day absences. If your child is arriving to school late, departing school early, or spending part of the school day out of school grounds, please ensure that the adult escorting your child has recorded their absence in the sign in and out **book at the front office**. We also ask that an adult inform your **child's class teacher** of their absence before or at the time it occurs, rather than retrospectively. This allows the class teachers to update our online attendance system with on time information. Please note, we are unable to confirm student absences through student's word alone. We can, however, be contacted via email, phone messages, notes or in person. Thank you!

Curriculum Foci

Numeracy Focus - ReSolve Investigation.

In mathematics we are investigating algebraic patterns of chicken boxes. The students are

constructing different shaped boxes and formulating relative rules using algebra to express the pattern of the array. The students are also using excel spreadsheet to model the pattern and checking their devised rules against the computer's algorithms.

Literacy Focus - Reading and writing a variety of information reports

We will be focusing on information reports for the rest of the term linking in with our Inquiry topic as we research and learn about discoveries.

Religious Education -

The Project Compassion theme this Lenten season is *Going Further Together*. We will be focusing on the stories of the people who have benefited from the fundraising from Caritas and their projects around the world. The Social Justice and House Leaders will be organising the Caritas Ks walkathon which will be held during Term 2.

Inquiry - The Journey to Discovery (Game Changers and Change Makers)

Each class will learn about a STEAM concept relating to the topic of Game Changers and Change Makers. Classes will work together to plan and develop an Expo to share their understanding of the concept. Within classes, students will work in small creative teams to contribute information/displays/exhibition/experiments to share within their classes.

Homework

This week students should be finalising their homework tasks to ensure they are ready to hand in on <u>Thursday 26th March</u>. Students must have a table outlining evidence of their learning for each week and how they have allocated their 30 minutes of homework time.
