A GREAT MAN

I have just been doing some reading about Nelson Mandela. To me, he is a hero of the twentieth century and an inspiration and a model for all.

Anyone who knows anything about him can't help but to admire a man that spent his life fighting oppression in peaceful ways. Imprisoned for twenty-eight years as a victim of apartheid, I would have expected anger and bitterness. The only model that this man has portrayed is that of tolerance and forgiveness.

Martin Luther King Jnr once wrote, "Everybody can be great, because anybody can serve. You don't have to have a College degree to serve. You don't have to make your subject and verb agree to serve. You only need a heart full of grace. A soul generated by love".

Although Nelson Mandala is an educated man, he showed the world what a "heart full of grace and a soul generated by love is all about". He eptomised it in everything he did.

Two thousand years ago, a fellow called Jesus showed us the same model of peace and love. I rather think that Jesus would admire what Mandala has achieved especially in the face of such adversity (a bit like Jesus' own story really). I don't know if Nelson Mandala was a religious man, but I do believe that God is at work through people that spread a message of love and tolerance. Nelson Mandala passed away on 5th December, 2013 but his memory will live on through the inspiration that he was to many thousands of others and I know that he is in God's loving care.

Speaking of journeys, I'd like to finish with a quote from Nelson Mandala.

"I have walked the long road to freedom.

I have tried not to falter; I have made missteps along the way.

But I have discovered the secret that after climbing a great hill,

One only finds that there are many more hills to climb.

I have taken a moment here to rest,

To steal a view of the glorious vista that surrounds me,

To look back on the distance I have come.

But I can only rest for a moment,

For with freedom comes responsibilities, and I dare not linger,

For my long walk is not yet ended"

Missing school can have a major impact on a child's future – a student missing one day a fortnight will miss four full weeks by the end of the year. By Year 10 they'll have missed more than a year of school.

There is no safe number of days for missing school – each day a student misses puts them behind and can affect their educational outcomes.

Coming to school every day is vital, but if for any reason your child must miss school, there are things we can do together to ensure they don't fall behind:

 Speak with your classroom teacher and find out what work your child needs to do to keep up. Remember, everyday counts.

FOUNDATION – Caz & Trish

Well here it is! Last week of Term 3!

What a busy term it has been, but the children have coped beautifully and continue to work hard. We especially enjoyed the 'Possum Magic' performance last week.

Mrs Shaw will be away on Long Service in weeks 1 and 2, Term 4. In her absence, Ms Eleanore Sirianni will be in Foundation Shaw. We welcome Eleanore and know that she will have a lovely time as will the students.

Religion:

This week the students will continue the unit, 'I am special, so are you'. The students have been busily defining what each member of their class brings to their classroom in their talents and gifts as an individual. Each student will bring a book about themselves home to share with you.

Literacy:

This week's fiction books
Foundation Levesque - 'Wacky Wednesday'
Foundation Shaw - 'The Foot Book'

Students will create words that have the short 'u' vowel sound, focussing on 'ust' and 'ung'.

Mathematics:

The students will be exploring what objects are heavier than others (hefting) and what container holds more or less. We will use words such as: heft, mass, balanced and unbalanced.

Inquiry:

Students will draw a picture showing good choices and how we treat each other, especially our friends.

RRRR's: Students will discuss different jobs where both men and women work.

Show and Tell -

This week - An interesting item found in the environment.

YEAR ONE/TWO – Janina, Amanda, David & Karen

The end of the term is here. We should all be proud of the children's achievements and we thank you for your ongoing support. We hope you enjoy the holiday break and look forward to hearing all about the holiday adventures.

We welcome Mrs Newton into Year 1-2 Bray on Thursday and Friday while Mrs Bray attends camp with the Year 3/4 students.

Our learning focus for the week -

<u>Religion</u> - We will finish our unit 'Grief and Loss' by looking at the memorial garden in our school and discussing how we can care for those who are experiencing sad times such as the loss of a loved one.

<u>Literacy</u> - our spelling topics this week, are 'and' as in 'hand' and 'ull' as in 'bull'. We will also further explore short and long vowel sounds in words - that is, looking at sound patterns when reading and using this knowledge, when writing. This week, we will explore 'suffixes' and how the use of these can change the meaning of the word. Through the listening to and discussing traditional fairy tale and other versions of these stories, the students are encouraged to predict, make inferences and personal connections to the text. Our writing will focus on 'Narrative writing' and we will be encouraging the students to use elements of the fairy tales they have heard and changing or adding something new.

<u>Mathematics -</u> our topics this week, will see us continue to focus on 'equal shares' and 'number sentences'. Through activities such as planning for a birthday party and planting garden beds, students will use mathematics in context to model sharing, represent and solve mathematical operations involving division eg. There were 5 children at the party, and they had 20 balloons between them, how many balloons did they have each? Activities will centre on grouping into equal sets and solving simple problems using these representations.

<u>Inquiry -</u> we finish our unit 'Celebrating differences' by giving the students time to plan and finish creating their own musical instrument inspired by another culture. This has been a wonderful unit and we are very impressed with the insights the students have shared about our uniqueness and acceptance of others.

Next term, our unit is called 'Robot Buddies' and focusses on creativity. If you have any wonderful creative ideas, picture story books or ideas for incursions, we would love to hear from you.

It is hard to believe the end of term is here. We would like to thank all our parents and families for their wonderful support this term.

Also please remember that your child will need to take a <u>fruit snack</u>, <u>recess</u>, <u>lunch</u> and a refillable drink bottle for the first day of camp.

Religious Education: This week in 'Community of Believers', the students have finished off researching the key events that shaped the early Church and the beginnings of St Patrick's Church.

Literacy & Inquiry: This week students completed their research of a well-known person with a disability as part of the Inquiry unit, **Someone Else's Shoes.** During Reading sessions, students have practised the skills of locating specific information and note-taking. In Writing sessions, they have learnt how to organise their research notes into sentences and paragraphs using a biography scaffold. They have presented their information about a well-known person with a disability either in the form of a slideshow or a written biography.

Spelling focus: This week we are focusing on the final blend digraphs: _wn, _wl, _wk, _mp as in own, owl, hawk and lamp.

Numeracy: This week in Numeracy students have continued to develop their understanding of the written forms of multiplication, including how to solve algorithms using the split strategy, the grid method and formal vertical multiplication. They have also applied these strategies to problem solving scenarios.

Absences/Late Arrivals: Please be advised that if a student is absent due to illness, an appointment etc. or if he/she will be arriving to school late, the school office or the classroom teacher must be notified either by phone, email or a note. A verbal notification of absence by the student's sibling or friend cannot be accepted for legal reasons.

Curriculum News:

Numeracy Focus

Students have completed the Maths Games Contest 5. The strategies practised were Divide a Complex Shape and Convert to a More Convenient Form. Teachers have noticed an improvement in student's ability to be able to solve multi-step, worded problems due to the continual practise of the BAR model and the **U**nderstand **P**lan **D**o **C**heck process this term.

Robotics - This term the Year 6 students will be participating in the Robotics program conducted in conjunction with GoTAFE Wangaratta. The students were introduced to the build design by Justin McMahon and have commenced the build stage of their robots.

Reading Focus - Students have completed their Slam Poetry piece which will be presented to their own class and selected students will present to a panel of judges including Jodi Gibson and Councillor Ashlee Fitzpatrick. Students have also completed a Picture Story book for the Foundation students that involved using a microscope and iPad to take photos and editing in Pages then publishing as an eBook. Work will be uploaded to Seesaw for parents to view soon, stay tuned!

Writing - Students continue to recognise and use various writing devices like repetition, imagery, similes, metaphors, alliteration, personification etc. A huge congratulations to Ada Overberg who recently won the Wangaratta Writers competition held by the Rotary Club. We are extremely proud of her fabulous piece of writing.

Inquiry - The Care for the Kids unit draws to a close, as a collective team we pray for those children less fortunate and as a school community will continue to support charities and raise awareness where appropriate.

RE - We will continue with discuss our Life Relationships for the remainder of the term, you might like to have a conversation with your child regarding any questions they might have before the Parent Session. The Parent night will be held early in Term 4.


Radio - Drew, John and Charles will be presenting the St Patrick's Radio Hour on Thursday from 2:00pm on Oak FM.
