Help Seeking

This week classes continue to embed strategies to assist with problem solving issues in the classroom and outside in the yard.

- Students describe factors that contribute to positive relationships with peers, other people at school, and in the community
- Students explain characteristics of cooperative behaviours and they use criteria to identify evidence of this in group activities
- Students identify a range of conflict resolution strategies to negotiate positive outcomes to problems

CHATTER MATTERS

An activity to build vocabulary - Affixes: Tell your child that affixes are extra parts that are "fixed on" to the base word. The affixes at the beginning of words are called "prefixes" because "pre-" means before, and a "suffix" comes at the end of a base word.

Ask your child to "fix" the broken base words with the correct "affix."

Literacy/Inquiry:

This week students are continuing to research their chosen endangered animal, taking notes and learning how to express the information they are gathering in their own words. This is being scaffolded so that one research component is being targeted at a time. Students are also getting the opportunity to share the information they are learning with their peers.

Our spelling focus this week continues to be initial (beginning) digraph blends (2 letters making the one sound): **sm_, sn_, sw_, sk_, st_, sp_ and sh_**.

Emphasis is also placed on phonemic awareness and isolating the different sound components in words. This is a vitally important skill to have in place so that we can make accurate approximations when spelling unfamiliar words.

Example: The word 'sweet' can be broken into three sound parts - **sw-ee-t**

Religion:

This week in the unit, "Sacraments of Initiation: Eucharist", the students are continuing to learn about the times and places where Jesus gathered with his friends for a meal and the actions of Jesus when he was with them. The students are then linking these findings to scripture passages in the Bible and then creating a dramatisation of the passage. For example Lk 22: 14-20 which recalls how Jesus shared a very special meal with his disciples (the first Holy Thursday).

Homework:

Thank you to our parents and students for the wonderful response to last week's **Reading Self-Assessment**. Being able to identify our strengths and challenges when we are reading is essential to developing our skills and becoming independent and proficient readers.

Students received their new Homework contract on Monday. Please ensure that your child completes all of the tasks by the due date. This may be different for each of the classes. Also, please remember that students are expected to read each evening and record a comment in their reading log to describe what they have learnt/where they are up to in their story. If you are unsure of the expectation, please check in with your child's classroom teacher.

Numeracy:

This week students are focusing on vertical subtraction with and without renaming. Learning tasks have been differentiated to account for differing levels of understanding. Some students are using concrete materials to model the subtraction process with teacher support, whilst other students are working independently to solve algorithms (vertical subtraction) and also, related word problems. Please check in with your child(ren) to see what they are working on in their classroom.

Curriculum News:

Numeracy Focus: This week we will continue the focus on fractions and decimals. Comparing and locating on a number line, adding and subtracting decimals, common fractions and equivalent fractions. Encourage your child to 'look for a pattern' when working with fractions and point out examples of fractions in the 'real world'.

Reading Focus: Hitler's Daughter text workshops this week at school courtesy of Monkey Baa Workshops. Focus remains on informative texts in the form of 'travel brochures' and using Infographics, in preparation for our Travel Expo.

Writing: Informative texts and persuasive writing for our travel brochures. Report reflection writing to be added onto student reports.

Inquiry: Students will be investigating topics like weather, natural/manmade attractions, location, culture and symbols linked with a country of their choice. Students will be analysing animal and human adaptations to aspects like climate and environment.

RRRR (Resilience, Rights and Respectful Relationships)

This term the Years 5 and 6 will be focussing on Help Seeking.

It is important to work with students to make sure they are aware about help-seeking avenues and confident to seek help from an appropriate source when needed.
