Some of our Year three students are about to embark on their preparation to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation next term.

When I was a little tacker (yes! I was once!), it was called the Sacrament of Confession. I was taught to list all the "bad" things that I'd done so that the priest could forgive me – well that was my understanding at the time. I must confess (!) that there were times when I embellished the list a bit because I felt that I didn't have enough things to confess. Things like fighting with my brothers often made the "embellished" list even if it wasn't true. Sometimes it was but it was never the "deal breaker" that I imagined it to be. I just didn't think God would like me if I fought with my brothers (all boy family... so fights were plentiful – my poor mum!).

Clearly, I missed the point of the Sacrament. That's what a little immaturity will do to a "fella".

The fact that this Sacrament is now called RECONCILIATION is a great thing. Reconciliation is all about looking at ourselves and what we do and seeing where this may be at odds with others and, by association, because we are all children of God, with God. It's not about languishing in some black hole of sinfulness and despair. It's about righting wrongs and moving forward in a positive way. The role of the priest is being a physical presence of God in this Sacrament. Priests don't think that they are God, but it's much more life giving to say sorry for misdeeds and regrets to someone rather than whisper them into the air, hoping that they'll find their way to God.

The Sacrament of Reconciliation is a growth point in our faith journey. It will grow with us as we mature and move through life. My understanding of Reconciliation is so much more advanced than when I first celebrated this Sacrament. I wish the same for these beautiful students of ours. That they'll see Reconciliation as an opportunity to foster a deeper relationship with God and to keep the brightness in their day. Dear Parents,

Well the last week of term is quickly drawing to a close. I just wanted to thank the staff, parents and students for their many wonderful contributions to the school this term. Term four will have its own exciting challenges which I look forward to.

Sacrament of Reconciliation

Preparation for the Sacrament of Reconciliation will be conducted next term with the Sacrament being celebrated on 13th (St Pats Church), 14th (St Bernard's Chapel) and 15th November (Our Lady's Church). Children only need to attend one of these nights to receive the Sacrament.

There will be a Parent Information Evening <u>TONIGHT</u> 7.00pm to 8.00pm (19th September) at the Our Lady's Church meeting room. Parents who have a child engaged in this preparation are encouraged to attend.

To receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation, children must be in Year Three or above. Children must be Baptised to receive this Sacrament and they cannot receive the Sacraments of Confirmation/Eucharist in Year Four without first receiving the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

RECESS and LUNCHTIMES

After staff discussions, we have decided to trial staggered breaks to allow students more room to play. For the first month of next term, our Foundation to Year Two students will have separate breaks to the Middle and Senior schools. This has taken quite a bit of co-ordination to achieve but I think we've got it right so far. This is a trial, so it will go through a process of modification over time to get the best results possible.

Beginning next term, the timetables will look like this:

12.45pm to 1.30pm	- Break
1.30pm to 3.30pm	- Session Three (with a short movement break in the middle)

Years Three to Six Timetable will be:

9.00am to 11.15am	- Session One
11.15am to 12.00pm	- Break
12.00pm to 1.30pm	- Session Two
1.30pm to 2.15pm	- Break
2.15pm to 3.30pm	- Session Three

As mentioned, we will adjust things as we go to get the best results for all concerned. The bottom line is that the younger students will have greater area to run around in and it will also free up spaces for the bigger students to engage in more active play. I'm always happy to field any questions or queries, so please do not hesitate to ask.

I would like to acknowledge the generosity of this wonderful staff here at St Pat's. It is less invasive of their time to keep the current system, but they could see the potential benefits for all students. Just another example of staff putting the students' needs first.

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CHATTER MATTERS

Once you and your child have talked about and read stories that deal with cause and effect, your child might have started to notice a pattern of words that indicate cause and effect. Ask your child to identify some of the "clue words" when you read together, that indicate cause and effect, e.g. 'as a result', 'because', 'consequently', 'due to', 'nevertheless', 'since', 'so', 'therefore', 'thus'. Challenge them to use some of these words when they are giving verbal explanations or reporting on something that happened. For example: "I have just cleaned my room consequently I think I should be allowed to stay at my best friend's house."

Literacy

In spelling, the Year 1 students are focusing on 'sw' as in 'swing'. We have been so impressed with the students' ability to brainstorm words with this sound.

The Year 2 students are concluding a term's work of successful spelling, by revising the spelling blends from each week. In addition to this, the students have located misspelt words from their writing books to include as part of the list of spelling words.

We encourage all Year One and Two children to read over the holidays, for continuity and to assist with the learning that will take place in Term Four. Please also look for any readers or library books that require returning.

Numeracy

In Year 1, students are revising counting and place value strategies learnt this term. We encourage our families to continue to find mathematics in their everyday lives over the holidays such as telling the time and counting money.

In Year 2, the students have continued with the unit on '3D Shapes' and have been identifying and describing common characteristics of 3D shapes such as faces, edges and vertices. The students have also looked at nets of shapes and have made their own cubes, rectangular prisms and triangular pyramids.

Religious Education

This week, we conclude our unit on Creation. The students have participated in a variety of experiences, culminating in a liturgy held two weeks ago, based on all things 'Creation.' Students also recently discussed using their senses to identify things in creation such as, I can *hear* thunder; I can *feel* the rain on my skin.

Inquiry

Next term, as part of our inquiry, 'Places and Spaces,' the students will be going for a learning walk to explore the building and features of our CBD. We would love some parent/friends to join us on this tour. Please let your child's classroom teacher know if you would be available to assist. Please note that a Working with Children Check is required, by law, for all parents on excursions.

Religion:

In Religion this week students will continue with God's Holy Word. Students will be asked to work in pairs to research a key person from the Bible, for example John the Baptist, Mary, Moses.

Literacy:

Writing/Inquiry

This week in Writing and Inquiry students will explore Indigenous Australian and European artefacts and discuss what they were used for. Students will work in pairs and research their information from the following website <u>https://australianmuseum.net.au/explore-indigenous-australian-objects</u> Some of the artefacts they will look at will be weapons, toys, tools and art work.

Reading:

This week some students are continuing with Readers Theatre. The students will work in small groups to rehearse a play focusing on their expression, fluency and pausing when reading. Students will be asked to record themselves reading using a macbook or ipad, then playing it back to themselves critiquing their reading. This will help students to focus on their fluency and expression. Some students are also finishing information reports on Indigenous Australians and their First Contact with Convicts.

Spelling:

This week the students are focusing on compound words e.g. back + fire = backfire, butter + fly = butterfly.

Numeracy:

This week students continue identifying and investigating angles. Students are exploring different types of angles such as obtuse, acute, reflect, right angle straight and full rotation angle in the environment. Students are learning how to use a protractor to measure angles in various situations.

Literacy

Students are continuing to engage in Literacy Circles and this week's focus is 'Text Connector'.

- Text-Text:- The War on Waste articles and videos they have watched and read, asks the students to make similar connections:

Students are investigating mapping and grid coordinates in numeracy this week as well as learning about the Cartesian coordinate system.

This week students are commencing a new unit of work which is called 'The Church in Australia'. During this unit students will identify the men and women who, with the help of the Holy Spirit, shaped and inspired the development of the Australian Catholic Church. They will also recount the story of one significant Australian Catholic, exploring how their faith enabled them to carry out their mission.

Social Emotional Learning (Rights, Responsibilities and Respectful Relationships)

This week we will be looking at the Topic 'Help Seeking'. The students will identify types of problems that they would seek independently, types of problems where they can benefit from seeking help from their peers and types of problems where they can benefit from seeking help from adults.

SEASONS FOR GROWTH

Seasons for Growth is a small group loss and grief education program. The Children and Young People's Program strengthens the social and emotional wellbeing of children and young people (aged 6 -18) who are dealing with significant loss or change. This may include the death of a loved one, parental divorce or separation, the experience and aftermath of natural disaster, moving house or school, as well as many other life changes and losses.

Small groups of 4-7 children work with a trained adult Companion (facilitator) who supports the children in learning new ways to share, think about and respond to the changes and losses in their lives. Children learn that they are not alone in dealing with the effects of change, loss and grief. They build their understanding and communication, decision making and problem-solving skills as part of a supportive peer group.

The Seasons for Growth Children and Young People's Program takes place over a structured eight-week period filled with peer-to-peer learning opportunities - with time to talk and listen as well as take part in activities including drawing, music, art, journaling, roleplays and storytelling. A celebration session and two follow up 'reconnector' sessions complete the program, and each session explores an age appropriate concept, for example "Change is a part of life" and "Caring for my feelings". The story of the seasons is used to explain the cycles of life, including change and loss, and provides a valuable metaphor for children to explore and understand their own story.

If you think your son / daughter would benefit from Seasons for Growth, I would encourage you to talk to him / her about this. Should you wish to participate, please fill in the tear off section below and return to the school within two weeks if possible. Please feel to contact Helen Lyons for further information.
