# **ANZAC DAY Vs COVID-19**

This Saturday we remember all those Australians who fought and served in wars. When I think of the bravery and dedication of these men and women, then, to me, it makes the sacrifices that we are currently going through seem a little insignificant. I had two grandfathers that fought in World War One in Europe. They stopped and trained in Egypt before heading to the Somme. I have postcards and letters from them when they were in Egypt. They paint a picture of what they were going through, the excitement and a sense of trepidation. I wonder, how many of their comrades didn't return? Such sadness and loss.

I was privileged to visit an Australian War Cemetery in Ypes (Belgium) a few years ago. Imagine being buried so far from home. The sadness of the families left behind with not even a grave to stand in front of to mourn their loss, to mark that they were once a part of a family who loved them and walked with them on this beautiful planet of ours.

It sort of makes being house bound for a little while and putting up with different ways of doing things because of COVID-19 seem a little tame really!

In all of these things though, there is a presence of God. The soldiers who risked their lives so selflessly to save others, the nurses who went above and beyond to help the wounded and to let them know that people valued and cared for them. For me there is an intangible but very spiritual presence involved, a deeper and more respectful understanding of the beauty of a life.

Today, we see many acts of kindness and charity. Helping those who are in need. Finding ways to connect with those we love and still keeping the social distancing relevant. All little things but each has at its heart, love which, to me, is the essence and presence of God in our world.

When I get a moment, I often pray for those who have passed away whether in armed conflict or as a result of this terrible pandemic and I thank God that I live in a country that has shown such value for life and protecting others. Something that cannot be said of all countries around the globe!

Dear Parents,

WOW! What strange times we are living in. Who would have thought, at the beginning of the year, that Term Two would look like this!

I want to begin by thanking you, the parents, for the huge support that you have been, not only to your children, but also to the staff. The feedback from home has been, in the most part, extremely positive. I get a sense that our parents know the extra mile that the teachers, Learning Support Officers (LSOs) and Administration staff have gone to in order to make remote learning as successful as it has been. It has certainly surprised me.

This week, I have sat in on a few remote learning lessons in the senior school. It was so nice to see the students faces again and the maturity with which they are tackling this situation, leaves me breathless. I have read the work being produced and I am blown away by the depth of the reflections.

It is not all plain sailing though. I know we have parents who are concerned that it's not all going to plan! NO! Everything won't be exactly the way it should be all the time (although, I'd hope things will gradually improve as the time wears on). Mistakes will happen and that's okay. A mindset that mistakes are the gateway to getting things right is probably the best attitude to have at the moment. You are not being judged on the support that you give to your children; you are being admired for the fact that you are prepared to "have a go!" I know that there is lots of communication happening between home and school using a range of strategies, make sure that you ask if you have any questions or concerns.

## Teachers and Staff

Each day we have a minimum of staff working onsite. We are trying to keep staff away and as safe as much as possible. If you are an essential service worker and you need to send your child/ren to school even if it's just for a day, then you need to communicate with your child/ren's teacher who will refer the matter to me. We cannot have students turning up unannounced as we would not have sufficient staff onsite to cater for them.

If you are not an essential worker but need to send your child for a day for compassionate reasons, then you will need to contact me (Terry) to discuss the issue. Clearly, we are here to support you in whatever way we can. That said, we still need to stick with the governmental advice as much as possible that states that, "children who can work from home, should work from home".

Your cooperation in this matter is appreciated.

## Reminder about entering the school

If you are entering the school for any reason, you will need to enter via the Office as, during this time of COVID-19, we are trying to minimalise the number of people entering the school in order to maintain as safe an environment as possible. If your child is a little anxious coming into school (the younger students especially), then you may escort them in but please do not enter the classroom, just drop them off at the door.

This Saturday is ANZAC Day. I am so disappointed that our students will not be involved in the ANZAC Day service. I know that there are lots of things happening in "classes" around this important event and I believe that some of that great work will be shared with parents/families. Something to look out for.

CHATTER MATTERS

As you read a story with your child, encourage your child to count the number of words in a sentence. Use your fingers to help. For example, 'How many words can you hear in this sentence?' She loves chocolate biscuits (has 4 words).

For older kids, say a sentence out of their reader/book and see if you can reorder the words to make new sentences. For example, the sentence "I can run fast and swim far" can be reordered to make: "I can run far and swim fast" or "can I run fast and swim far?

Here are some sentences to start you off (remember to choose sentences from your child's book/reader):

- a. Mike has a red lolly and Sarah has a blue ball.
- b. She went to the shops after she went to the pool.
- c. Please move quickly to the door.
- d. Lucy painted a picture of Mike while he rode his bike.
