Technology plays a major part in our lives to such an extent that we no longer are aware of its influence unless it is shoved in our faces with a spectacular light show or similar. I love technology as, generally speaking, it does so much good for our society. However, it does have a dark side that can invade our personal space.

I went to pop around to a mate's place last Saturday, as I do most Saturdays, only to have my phone buzz in my pocket how far it is to my destination and how long it will take! REALLY! Am I that exposed to technology that it knows what I'm doing without being told! I found that particularly irritating and I immediately turned on my privacy settings (not that I trust them that much either). But that's nothing compared to the potential harm the internet can do to our children if used without adequate adult supervision.

I worry most for our young people in this day and age, as they can be exposed to a range of insidious and evil things that can easily bypass the most caring of parents. It is important to educate our children as to how to identify and cope with a range of personal invasions that are possible through technology. I am aware that a number of children are accessing social media. Even though you must be thirteen years old, many much younger have access and most of those without the knowledge of their parents.

As parents, it is important to be aware of what our children are accessing as they don't have the maturity to always make the correct decisions. Parents who communicate well with their children have the most chance of helping their children navigate these mine fields because the deeper the relationship, the deeper the trust. The child who can talk to Mum or Dad when they come across something that is wrong are far better able to cope with the pressures that such evil brings. RESILIENCE is the catch word and resilience is nurtured in kind and loving relationships.

From a faith perspective, even at our lowest times, we can look to God for support. This is, in itself, a form of resilience whether through prayer or through the care and nurture of others. We all need support but it's up to each of us to realise that and do something about it.

To finish, I'd like to pose a question. Do you know what programs your child is accessing, and do you know what those programs involve? If you don't, then it's probably time you did. I must admit that I'm a bit of an advocate for children to access technology in public (and not in the privacy of their bedrooms etc) as a means of protection.

I pray that these beautiful children of ours will never be subjected to the evils of the internet but, if they are, I pray that they have a loving and supportive base that will help them through the difficult times.


Narrative

Aim to read one book a day with your child (repeating books is OK!). It is important that during reading, you begin to take turns in talking about what is happening in the pictures and ask your child questions that focus on the elements of the story. Use the following questions to help:

- Who is in the story? Where are they? When is the story happening?
- What was the problem?
- How did the characters feel?
- What did the characters decide to do?
- What happened next? What was the solution?
- How will the story end?

FOUNDATION - Caz, Trish & Karen

We welcome back Mrs Bray to school, it is lovely to see her smiling face again. We have enjoyed and thank Ms Collins for working and looking after all of us over the last two weeks.

Religion

The students had a wonderful visit to Our Lady's Church and School yesterday. The students will make a replica of a Church later in the week.

Literacy

This week the students will read, discuss and wonder as they listen to three fiction shortlisted books for Book Week, The Sloth Who Came to Stay, Florette and Can You Find Me? The children will also listen and read non-fiction texts that relate to the fiction story. The students will create their own fact book.

Mathematics

The students will begin a new unit on addition. The students will represent practical situations to model addition. They will explore a range of practical strategies for adding small groups of numbers, such as visual displays or concrete materials.

Game - Roll two dice, how many dots do you have altogether? How can you work this out? Is there an easier way to add them together? (You can play using cards)

Inquiry

The students will continue to identify and work as a community. You could discuss with your child how you are involved in a community and what your role is within this community.

Show and Tell

Literacy

In spelling, the Year 1 students are looking at the 'sl' sound as in slug. Students are really enjoying a range a spelling activities including spelling walks, word searches, sentence activities and hangman.

The Year 2 students are looking at multiple, but similar, blends – ing, ang and ong. We have looked at these blends as being both word endings, as well as initial and middle blends. The students were able to brainstorm quite a comprehensive list!

The Year 2 students are also focusing on the use of Prepositions in their reading and writing this week, particularly in describing the location of an item.

Numeracy

In Year 1, students are developing their confidence with number sequences to and from 100 by twos, fives and tens from any starting point. We have enjoyed inquiry-based activities from the reSolve website which was introduced to the teachers on our Closure Day earlier in the term. Don't forget to check out SeeSaw to see some of the amazing things the students have been doing in class.

In Year 2, the students are applying their knowledge of fractions of a whole, to solve fractions of groups. This involves breaking up groups of items into quarters, halves and eighths.

Religious Education

We have commenced our new unit, Creation. Students have initially brainstormed what they think the word 'Creation' means and, in particular, God's Creation. We have had some lovely responses.

<u>Inquiry</u>

For the remainder of the term we are focusing on old fashioned games including hopscotch, spinning tops, elastic and tiddlywinks etc. If families have any old games at home that they would like to share, please bring them along to school with names clearly labelled. The students will be learning a range of games and then teaching their peers and other students how to play these fun and interactive games.

YEAR THREE/FOUR - Sarah, James & Karen

Reminders: Book Week Parade: 23rd August

Religion:

This week students are finishing the topic, 'Followers of Jesus' by reading the parable, 'The Good Samaritan'. Students will discuss what they have read and relate this to their own lives through a modern dilemma/problem. Students will then create images through photos/mime/drama of these problems/injustices and show how they can be a follower of Jesus in these situations. Students will name and display the values associated with being a follower of Jesus e.g. respect, consideration

Literacy

Writing:

This week in writing the students will continue with informational report writing. Students will research information about the 'Journey of the First Fleet', the food and supplies taken on the voyage and the effects the First Fleet had when arriving in Australia. Students will be asked to read the information in a whole group, then discuss the information putting vital information into dot points.

Reading:

This week some groups continue reading and finishing their books during reading circle time. As our Inquiry Unit is on the First Contact, classes will then look at Indigenous stories and finding the message and the moral of the story.

Spelling:

This week in spelling we are focusing on Irregular Plurals for example foot-feet, goose-geese and woman-women.

Numeracy:

This week we are continuing our shape investigation. We are looking at composite shapes which are composed of a variety of 2D shapes for example, a 2D drawing of a house usually consists of squares for the house and windows, rectangles for the door and chimney and a triangle for the roof. We will also explore the features of 3D shapes and connect the 2D faces on a net to help create a 3D shape. The students will be assessed on their ability to compare and describe the features of 2D and 3D shapes.

Inquiry:

Students will watch a youtube clip about the Arrival of the First Fleet. Using the clip, students will be asked to consider the invasion of Australia looking through the eyes of Indigenous Australians. Students will read as a whole group, information about the First Contact.

YEAR FIVE/SIX – Nara, Paul, Andrea, Helen, Sharyn & Catherine

Literacy

This week is National Book Week, we will be reading some of the shortlisted and winning books in this year's awards as well as getting in costume for the St Patrick's Book Parade on Thursday. The students will continue to explore how writers convey their message through online media platforms. Students are exploring the War on Waste website and discovering techniques that are used to convey meaning and put forward a point of view. They will be analysing the use of logos, titles, slogans and considering their effectiveness. What can you do at home to fight the **WAR ON WASTE?** Students continue to be engaged in Literacy Circles. This week's role is Discussion Director, students are encouraged to pose 'open-thick' questions about the novel they are reading. Questioning and interpreting what we are reading is integral to our reading experience. Please continue to read with and encourage your child to read at home each night. Here are some thinking stems to create some discussion:

- I think the author wrote this book to ...
- This situation reminds me of...
- The big idea in this book is...
- If I were the author I would have changed the part where...
- I found this book hard to follow when...
- To summarise what I have read I would say....

Numeracy

Students are thoroughly engaged in our Democracy Maths Investigation. Here is the spreadsheet used to collate the results from the posed question - *What is your favourite playtime activity*? This data was collected from our 'Year 1/2 electorate' collected by scrutineers 5 O'Connor to determine the top activities to place on the preferential ballot paper for that electorate. *What activities would be representative of the year 1/2 electorate? Would that be the same as our 5/6, 3/4 or Foundation electorate? Why/why not? How will this assist us in decision making across the school?*




