

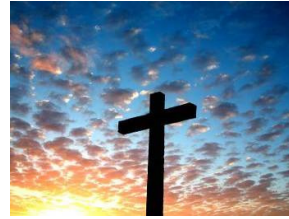

# WHAT'S HAPPENING IN THE CLASSROOM

## FOUNDATION – Caz & Trish

Welcome back everyone! We hope you had an enjoyable break and lovely Easter with your families. We are looking forward to another exciting term with you and your children.

**REMINDER - NO SCHOOL TOMORROW ANZAC DAY.** Your child is invited to march with the students from St Patrick's school tomorrow morning. Please wear school uniform.

**Religion:** At the end of term 1, we had been listening, reading and completing many activities about the events that took place during Holy Week and Easter. This week we will read about 'The Resurrection' and respond to it through questions and drawings.

Next week we will start the new unit, '**Called to Live Like Jesus.**'

**Literacy:** The Foundation students will work through a variety of activities related to the big book in their class.

Foundation Levesque - 'The Jigaree'

Foundation Shaw - 'Mrs Wishy Washy's Big Tub'

**Mathematics:** The unit for this week is Data Representation. The students will collect information through yes and no questions and then they will create simple data displays using objects and drawings to show their gathered information.

**Inquiry: 'Our Sustainable World'** is the unit the students will be investigating this term. The students will look at what is required to keep our world sustainable and what they can do to help.

**Sport Days - Change of day -** The students will be involved in the BLUEARTH program this term with Matt Dillon. The Foundation's Sports day will be **TUESDAY and FRIDAY (Bluearth occurs on Friday's)**.

We look forward to another exciting term with your children and to working alongside you all in the continued learning of the students.

## YEAR ONE/TWO – Janina, Amanda, David & Karen

We hope all our families had a lovely Easter and holidays. We are excited to start term 2, another busy one with lots of fantastic learning opportunities and fun to be had along the way.

**Literacy:**

The week in spelling we are focusing on the 'o' as in pot and 'oo' as in book. Through our spelling investigations we have been looking at other graphemes (spelling choices) to make these sounds.

For example:

The 'o' as in pot can also be made with 'a' as in swan

The 'oo' as in book can also be made with 'u' as in bull

In writing, students have written some fabulous Easter holidays recounts with 'sizzling starts' and adjectives to describe the fun they had with family and friends.

Well done to all those students who continued their home reading over the holidays. Keep up the great work!

### **Numeracy:**

In numeracy this week students have been exploring, describing and continuing simple patterns with both objects and numbers.

### **Religion:**

We are starting off the term with 'Easter'. Students will examine the events of Holy Week and the first Easter Sunday, and the rituals and symbols we use to celebrate Jesus risen and alive. Students will have the opportunity to participate in a variety of Easter prayer experiences that will enrich and consolidate their learning.

### **Inquiry:**

Taking responsibility in looking after our environment so that it is preserved for future generations was a key focus for Term Two's inquiry 'Tip Toe Through Our World'. Students will learn about how they can reduce, reuse and recycle and the ethics behind sustainability.

## **YEAR THREE/FOUR – Sarah, James, Karen & Nara**

Welcome back to Term 2 in the 3/4 Unit. We hope that everyone enjoyed a well-earned break and had an opportunity to make some precious memories with family and friends.

Please remember to return all raffle tickets for our upcoming Mayfair by this Friday 26th April, sold or unsold.

### **Literacy:**

For the first half of Term 2 we will be focusing on the different forms of ***persuasive writing*** such as a letter to the editor, an advertisement, an interview, a discussion, the review of a written or media text, an editorial, a protest banner **and** an exposition, through both Reading and Writing sessions. In Writing we will be specifically learning how to write an expository text. This type of writing is used to present a point of view, in favour or against, relative to a specific topic. Expositions analyse, interpret and evaluate the world around us.

Spelling: focus this week is 'ea' as in meat, bean, team and beam.

### **Homework:**

This week students have been given a relatively simple homework contract to ease them back into Term 2. Please ensure that you assist your child to check that they have completed each of the assigned tasks to the best of their ability. ***Also, as per last term, we would like all of our students to record (or dictate to a parent) 1-2 sentences in their reading logs each evening, to demonstrate what they have read / new knowledge they have gained.***

Due to the fact that each classroom teacher may have a different 'due date' on the contract, please check this carefully to ensure that it is submitted on time.

## **Numeracy:**

This week we will be concluding our unit on 'Time'. The students have been focusing on reading and recording analogue and digital time at minute intervals. They have also engaged in real-life problem-solving tasks where they have been required to apply their understanding of time concepts.

## **Religious Education:**

This term some of our students will be receiving the Sacraments of Confirmation and Eucharist, so our Religious Education units will mirror this. The place of the Sacraments of Initiation – Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist – the basis for Christian life in the Catholic Tradition will be explored collectively, however, for the first half of this term we will be specifically developing our understanding of Confirmation and its relation to Baptism, and how we and others use the gifts of the Spirit to bring about the reign of God. Students will be introduced to the idea that when the community of believers – the Church – celebrates a Sacrament, God is present in the celebration.

By the conclusion of this unit students should be able to:

- Identify the gifts of the Holy Spirit present in us at Baptism and affirmed in us at Confirmation.
- Identify how people use the gifts and fruits of the Spirit in our community.
- Name and explore the symbols associated with the Sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation.

## **Inquiry:**

Our Term 2 Inquiry unit is called 'Look What We Have Got' and our throwline is 'Sustainability'. This unit specifically focuses on developing an understanding of the importance of habitats for plants and animals, and it encourages students to think and act sustainably when they interact with the environment.

During this unit students will:

- design and conduct scientific experiments.
- observe how a change of state between liquid and gas can be caused by adding or removing heat.
- explore the importance of habitats for plants and animals.
- develop an understanding of the positive and negative effect that humans can have on the environment.

## **YEAR FIVE/SIX – Andrea, Helen & Sharyn**

**Numeracy Focus** - NAPLAN problem solving questions and pre-tests for addition and subtraction.

**Reading Focus** - Reading different fiction and nonfiction text types related to narrative texts with a focus on **Within the Text**.

**Writing** - Narrative writing

### **Religious Education - The Risen Christ**

In this unit students will reflect on the mystery of the resurrection by entering the experience through the eyes of the disciples who first gave witness to Jesus' risen presence amongst them. They will also explore ways they integrate the resurrection experience into their own lives.



## **RRRR (Resilience, Rights and Respectful Relationships)**

This term the Years 5 and 6 will be focussing on Help Seeking.

Children can experience all kinds of challenges as they grow and develop. The help-seeking behaviours of children are fundamental to their mental health and wellbeing. Encouraging and fostering help-seeking behaviours is one way to improve mental health and wellbeing.<sup>16</sup> It is important to work with students to make sure they are aware about help-seeking avenues and confident to seek help from an appropriate source when needed.

Learning activities in this topic area are designed to help students discuss the importance of seeking help and providing peer support when dealing with problems that are too big to solve alone. This helps to normalise and de-stigmatise help-seeking behaviour. Scenario-based activities help students identify situations in which help should be sought, identify trusted sources of help, and practice seeking help from peers and adults.
