These last few days have been highly productive for the teachers and staff as we prepare for the beginning of term two, still unsure if we will be teaching face-to-face or remotely and/or online.

Yesterday, after an initial briefing, we worked in our unit groups to plan across the range of subject areas. We checked in, as a whole group, a few times during the day to ensure that there was continuity in our planning and to share thoughts and ideas for presenting work. I really feel that tremendous progress has been made and I am very confident that the students will have a very effective program to work on. Clearly not as effective as face-to-face learning but significant, nonetheless.

Teachers are very mindful of maintaining communication with home and we have quite a few options up our sleeve. Our See-Saw App will be useful as will Google Meet where we can gather as a group online (where possible), telephone calls, emails just to name a few.

I cannot stress too highly the importance of communication at this time. You will never be a bother, you will never be a nuisance because, we know, that working closely with our families gives our children the best support possible.

Our <u>Administration Officers</u> have "ploughed on" and kept things running (Well done <u>Annette and</u> Rosie).




