ADVENT

WHAT'S HAPPENING IN THE CLASSROOM

FOUNDATION - Caz, Karen & Trish

Tonight, St Patrick's school will be holding their annual sports evening at Appin Park oval at 5.00pm - 7.00pm. Your child will participate in three events for the evening. Last week your child brought home a note explaining the team colour your child will represent. See you all there tonight!

A huge THANK YOU to the marvellous home reading that is still occurring. Some students have reached over 200 nights reading! What a tremendous reading routine you have established for your child.

Religion

We continue to explore the unit, 'I Am Special So Are You'. This week, the students will continue to create class books that will share the special gifts each and every child shares with others. They will write and draw a response about each student and when finished this will be a keepsake to take home.

Literacy -

We continue to explore Fairy Tales. How marvellous to share these 'old classics' with the students. Have you shared your favourite fairy-tale with your child?

This week, the Foundation classes will focus on -

Foundation Shaw - Rumpelstiltskin

Foundation Bray - Goldilocks and the Three Bears

Foundation Levesque - Cinderella

Mathematics

This week, the students will revise their understanding of place value and continue to count forwards and backwards from various numbers. Can you see a pattern? What numbers can you and your child read?

'Highest Number"- Using a pack of cards or two dice, create a number. Who has made or rolled the highest number? (Extension - You could turn over three or four cards or roll the dice three or four times to create a larger number.)

Inquiry

As a part of our unit 'Great and Small', the students will consider how places change and how we need to adapt to these changes. Through time lapse videos, the students will view the changes that occur in the life of a monarch caterpillar such as: chewing a hole in the egg, wiggling out of the egg, eating leaves to get bigger and becoming a caterpillar.

The students will be asked to consider what they might see during each season. They will link the seasons to changes in animals and consider what they are differently.

LITERACY

Year One

Reading: We are looking at Predicting as a strategy to develop comprehension when reading. Again we will practise this skill using a variety of great picture story books.

Writing: We are continuing to look at Persuasive writing and the different forms it can take. The children will have an opportunity to express an opinion and do their best to persuade others through their persuasive writing pieces.

Spelling: We are revising some of the sound blends that we have looked at throughout the year, this week we are looking at **ee as in feet** and **u as i up, cup.**

Year Two

Reading: An emphasis on summarising continues. This will help the children comprehend what they have read. Whilst reading, the children should be using appropriate expression, eg pitch, pause, emphasis and attending to punctuation. They will also use comprehension strategies to build literal and inferred meaning to expand content knowledge, integrating and linking ideas and analysing and evaluating texts.

Writing: We will be revising correct choice and consistent use of present tense and past tense throughout writing. We will look at different ways to start some sentences so as to avoid too much repetition, to make my writing more interesting or to fit with a genre. Following on from last week the use of adverbs will be encouraged to add further interest to sentences.

Handwriting we are revising the correct formation of letter 'li'.

Spelling: We are looking at 'qu' words as in quack and looking at these words within our everyday reading.

MATHS

Year One - Over the next two weeks in Numeracy we will be doing lots of revision work in the areas of Number and Algebra, Measurement and Geometry and Statistics and Probability.

Year Two - This week the children will look at Months and Seasons, naming and ordering them. They will begin to understand the months and characteristics of seasons and compare cultural interpretations of seasons in Australia.

RELIGION

Our unit of work on Advent - Getting Ready for Jesus continues. The children will be learning about the Annunciation, when Mary willingly accepted God's will to become the Mother of Jesus. We will also look closely at Mary's special prayer, 'The Hail Mary' and have an opportunity to say this prayer as part of our daily class prayers.

INQUIRY

We continue to focus on 'People and Places in our Community'. The Year One Children have been working on completing a 'Birds eye view' of their community of Wangaratta with a focus on including all of those important places such as the Police Station, Fire Station, Newspaper and Library, some of which we were fortunate enough to visit during the Term.

Religious Education:

This week the students are finishing the unit, 'Jesus Models Forgiveness' by drawing a story map of a time when they have needed forgiveness and experienced reconciliation, showing the four steps – admit, say sorry, forgive and reconcile. The students will also write a sorry prayer or an acrostic poem about forgiveness.

Literacy:

Reading

Students look at information about our Neighbouring Countries from Inquiry. They will first read information about their selected country and where it is situated. Students will highlight key words from the information they have read.

Writing:

The students are reviewing the layout of an information report and using it as a guide to complete reports on their selected neighbouring country to Australia in Inquiry.

Spelling:

This week in spelling the students are looking at words from our Inquiry unit, 'Our Island Home', finding their meanings and putting them into sentences.

Numeracy:

Following on from fractions the students are looking at the connections between fractions and decimal notation. They will explore tenths and hundredths in the place value system through games such as 'Guess My Number'; 'Decimal Bingo'; ordering decimals from largest to smallest; and reading and writing decimal numbers.

Inquiry:

This week in Inquiry, the students are researching and investigating who are Australia's neighbouring countries. They will create a project/slideshow about their selected country with interesting information which includes natural features, vegetation, important buildings, a map of its location in relation to Australia, traditional cuisine and celebrations. It should be very interesting!!

Food for thought:

As there is a change in this term's timetable with the middle block being longer, it might be a good idea to pack an extra piece of fruit or sandwich for that extra bit of energy!! Also, with the weather warming up, please ensure your child has a water bottle. Thank you!!

YEAR FIVE/SIX - Nara, Paul, Andrea, Helen, Sharyn

Literacy

In Reading this week students are continuing to learn to think critically about different types of text. They are using a variety of non-fiction texts to develop an understanding of the different genres and special forms within the larger category of non-fiction texts. Students are also learning how to express their reasoning relative to a writer's purpose in selecting a particular genre, topic, subject or type of narrative structure.

In Writing, students learning about descriptive writing and are writing reports to share with their peers.

Numeracy

Over the course of the next week we will be developing our understanding of measurement. Students will learn to:

- Calculate the areas of rectangles and triangles.
- Convert units of measurements from cm to mm.
- Measure mass, volume and capacity, and convert between different units of measurements.

Religious Education

Students are completing the unit, 'Discovering Our Christian Heritage'. They are exploring Christianity in the context of its origins in Judaism and comparing the similarities and differences with other world religions. Students will be guided to develop an awareness of the rituals and symbols, customs and practices of the world's three monotheistic faiths – Christianity, Judaism and Islam, and understand that there are strong links among the basic beliefs of each faith.

Social Emotional Learning (Rights, Responsibilities and Respectful Relationships)

We are currently focusing on 'Gender and Identity'. The students will '...analyse the impact of peer and adult actions in maintaining or changing contemporary gender norms; develop an awareness of the impact of gender norms on the attitudes and behaviours of those entering

adolescence; identify the standards and associated actions that underpin respectful gender relations.' (Resilience, Rights and Respectful Relationships p. 64) This week students will specifically focus on the topic, 'Born or Made? Thinking About Gender'. Students will be required to think about and describe the way in which gender influences how people relate to young children.

AN INVITATION FROM THE CATHOLIC PARISHES OF WANGARATTA

The Catholic Church in Australia will be holding a Plenary Council in 2020. A Plenary Council is a formal meeting of the bishops and other representatives of all the dioceses and eparchies of the Catholic Church in Australia. Its purpose is to discern what God is asking of us in Australia at this present time. While the church should be asking that question continually, a Plenary Council is a particularly graced instrument for seeking the Holy Spirit's guidance. And it has the authority to make church laws on the results of its discernment. Although in the end it will be the bishops who will vote on any future directions for the church in Australia, they will be making those decisions in the light of a long listening to the Holy Spirit speaking through the voices of any of the faithful who wish to speak around Australia. Everyone's experience of faith and Church is unique and it is important that the Council hear from as many responses as possible.

Reflection Question: What do you think God is asking of us in Australia at this time?

Join us in our listening and dialogue sessions in Wangaratta:
