All Saints and All Souls Day

Everyday counts - school attendance

We all want our students to get a great education, and the building blocks for a great education begin with students coming to school each and every day.

Missing school can have a major impact on a child's future – a student missing one day a fortnight will miss four full weeks by the end of the year. By Year 10 they'll have missed more than a year of school.

There is no safe number of days for missing school – each day a student misses puts them behind and can affect their educational outcomes.

Coming to school every day is vital, but if for any reason your child must miss school, there are things we can do together to ensure they don't fall behind:

• Speak with your classroom teacher and find out what work your child needs to do to keep up. Remember, everyday counts.

CHATTER MATTERS

Extending children's sentences:

Have a look at the pictures and sentences with your child. Encourage them to extend the sentence using the following prompts: Who (e.g. The man); Where (e.g. at the bank, in Australia); When (e.g. time, day) What doing (running); What like (big, blue)



For example:



Short sentence: The Tiger is in the water. Extended sentence: The famished tiger waded through the water before he caught his prey.

Ask your teacher about how they are using these sentence prompts in class.

What Parents Need to Know About Tik Tok

Tik Tok is an app that is open to the world, so mature content can (and does) appear in the stream. Thankfully, the app has privacy settings available. You can decide whether or not you want others to find you; set your account to private so other users cannot view your uploaded content; and select who can send you a message, leave comments, and singalong with you.



The app store rating is 12+, however Common Sense Media rates it at 16+.

However, there is no system in place to verify a user's age, so anyone can download it. Because of the access to inappropriate content, and the use of popular music that may contain explicit language, this is not an app for young kids. Concerned parents can use the <u>parental control</u> <u>settings</u> on their children's devices to prevent them from downloading the app.

Like all games and social networks, it is certainly imperative parents do their homework if they are going to allow their child on apps that are generally not recommended for their age. That means finding out all you can on how to set it up safely, recognising the risks and having the appropriate and ongoing conversations with your child. I am often reminded that if we are allowing them to play in public places, we must recognise that the cognitive brain development of most young people is simply not there yet to make some of the important decisions and engage in the critical thinking that is expected of them at this level of playing.

SCHOOL COUNCIL

FOUNDATION – Caz & Trish

This Friday we will be thrilled to welcome, pray and share our learning with our Grandparents and Special Friends. We will begin at 2.15pm under the shed for a prayer time together then the children will show their Grandparents their classrooms.

Religion: We continue the unit, 'Our Church'. The students will begin to develop an understanding of Church as a welcoming and caring community that gathers to celebrate.

Literacy

This week, the students have focused on the use of pronouns in their writing. We have also continued our text focus on picture story books, particularly focusing on the creativity involved in the storyline and illustrations. This has allowed students to analyse language, illustrations and text structures.

The spelling focus, this week is 'sm' as in 'smog' and 'or' as in 'torn'.

Numeracy

Our focus in Numeracy continues this week on 'money and financial mathematics.' Students have been discussing the properties of Australian coins and notes, including their size, colour and design. Students have also ordered coins and notes according to their value. The concept of money is one that lends itself well to numeracy discussions at home. Spelling focus:

The children are continuing to develop their characters to help them to plan their scripts.

Numeracy:

This week in Numeracy Students are continuing to explore 'angles' and 'shapes'. They will be developing an understanding of the names of angles such as acute, obtuse, right angle, reflex angle, straight angle and their size. The children are being introduced to measure angles using a protractor, to measure the size of angles.

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Curriculum News:

Numeracy Focus -This week we are building upon the knowledge gained about calculating volume last week, by using nets of shapes to create 3D objects. Students are also using multiple views of block towers to construct cities that match the views given. Students will learn that the number of cubes used to build the city is its volume. Using visual perspectives is a vital ingredient in this task.



Robotics - Year 6 students have completed the build stage of their robots and are ready to head to GoTafe to program the robots to perform simple tasks on Thursday.

Reading Focus - Students will investigate the Jackie French natural disaster series to make comparisons and analyse French's style. Over the next four weeks, students will explore the picture story books and critically analyse vocabulary choice, intended tone and how French has used research knowledge of historical content to create the fictional texts. They will also explore the symbolism of Bruce Whatley's illustrative techniques during class and Art time.

Writing Focus - Students will use techniques learnt during reading sessions and experiment within their own historical narrative writing.

Inquiry - In the Bizarre Bazaar unit, students will gain a real-life understanding of the design and production process when creating a brand for a new product. They will produce and sell a product at the **Bizarre Bazaar Market** later this term. We will be aiming to use as much recycled materials as we can. The students are looking for the following if families have these could they drop them into the 5/6 area:

- 1. Fishnet Stockings
- 2. Small cylinder-shaped Containers (like camera cartridges)
- 3. Small plastic rectangle containers
- 4. Elastic
- 5. Fabric of any type

RE - Students explore the enduring questions 'Why do we have Sacraments?' and 'How can the Sacraments influence my life?'. You might like to discuss Sacraments with your child at home.
