COVID19- Regulations for schools

Just to make sure that we are all on the same page the following rules will apply until further notice (under the guidance of the Department of Education and the Catholic Education Office):

- **PICK-UP/DROP OFF** Where the school has developed specific processes to ensure smooth and safe delivery and collection of the children, parents must be made very much aware of these processes.
- IF CHILDREN ARE UNWELL Parents must be advised that any child who comes to school feeling unwell or becomes unwell during the school day, they (or the emergency contact person) will be called to collect that child.
- **WATER BOTTLES** drinking fountains are not to be used by students. Each child should bring water from home.
- WHICH YR 3 TO YR 10 STUDENTS MAY ATTEND only the children who are deemed by the school to be in particular need (i.e. vulnerable if not at school) and the children of employees whose job is classified as an Essential Service.
- **RESTRICTED ACCESS TO SCHOOL BY ADULTS** The Department of Health insists that no adultparents, non-enrolled youths, visitors - is to enter the school unless necessary or in an emergency. Adults should not be permitted to go beyond the Reception area.

End of the Day beginning next week

In order for a safe and efficient way to allow parents to collect their children from school, we will open the large gate on Ovens Street. This should allow for a smoother flow of students to their parents without the congestion getting out the gate. We will trial this to gauge its effectiveness.

Enrolments for 2021

If you have a child starting school next year, can you let the office know to make sure we have our existing families covered.

Also, if you are aware of other families considering St Patrick's as an option for their child for next year, then encourage them to contact the school to secure their place.

Outside of School Hours Care

Just a reminder that, as school begins back in earnest, so too, does our OSHC Service. Bookings need to be made if you do not have a permanent booking as we need to ensure sufficient staff are engaged for each evening. CHATTER MATTERS

The game 'Sound Thief' is a great way to support your child to develop their manipulation of sounds in words (deleting, adding or swapping sounds). Use real objects or pictures to represent words, then take turns to steal a target sound. The other player/s need to identify the word and the "sound stolen". For example: hat à "at" (you stole the "h" sound from hat).

As a harder task, try swapping a sound in a word. For example: back à "ban" (you changed the 'k' sound to a 'n' sound). Decide with your child first the position of the sound to swap – beginning / middle / end.



Gratitude and Empathy

Some students are a bit anxious about what has been going on in the world, and it is so good that they can express how they feel to an adult. As an adult we need to listen to their feelings, concerns and worries. Together we can discuss gratitude and empathy on a daily basis.

Gratitude is the ability to pay attention to what you have, as opposed to worrying about the things you don't have.

Empathy is when you put yourself in someone else's shoes. It is when you put selfless thoughts into action.

For example, when you are together, ask "who is someone you were grateful for today and why?" or "can you think of someone that might be going through a tough time?" "What made you feel happy today?" "Describe/draw how you felt today. I wonder why you felt like that"

WHAT'S HAPPENING IN THE CLASSROOM

FOUNDATION – Caz & Trish

Well it has been a very busy time since we returned to school. The students have slipped back into their school setting and are very happy to be working hard. It certainly is lovely to have the Foundation students back at school.

Thank you again for adhering to the safety rules at the gate in the mornings and at pick up time. We really appreciate it.

Important messages:

Please be mindful to check your children's hair for head lice as we have had cases in the Foundation area.

We ask that you have your children at school before the beginning of the day bell that rings at 9.00am. We are having children arriving late to school and it is quite disruptive to their and others' learning. Thank you for your cooperation.

Religion:

This week we begin the new unit of, 'Called to Live Like Jesus'. In this unit the students will find a purpose for acting as Jesus did. They will understand that when they do this, they are living as Jesus showed us. They will relate it to how they care for themselves and others in the world.

Literacy:

The Foundation students will continue to work through a variety of activities related to the big book in their class. They will continue to write lists, letters and labelling relating to the big book. The students continue to practise the most used words daily and sounds and letters.

Foundation Levesque - 'Dan the Flying Man'. Foundation Shaw - 'The Hungry Giant's Lunch'.

We ask you to please continue to maintain a regular reading routine with your children at home.

Why is reading so important?

Enjoying books and reading stories from a very early age is crucial in the development of children. It helps with their ability to understand words, use their imagination and develop their speech, as well as being something they really enjoy.

Maths:

The students will continue to connect number names, numerals and quantities, including zero. They will be counting forwards, backwards, before and after using numbers between 0-20 using numbers from the 100 chart. The students will play games that practice numbers. We are focusing on 'teen' numbers and that 'teen' numbers always start with the number one.

<u>Sport days</u> are on **TUESDAYS**, **THURSDAYS** and **FRIDAYS**. Matt Dillon, the Bluearth Teacher, will lead the Foundation students in a Bluearth session on FRIDAYS for 30 minutes.

YEAR ONE/TWO – Janina, Amanda, Elise, David, Karen & Leah

Another wonderful week of learning and lots of smiling, happy students! Haven't they done us proud! Children seem to be well and truly back into the swing of things and adjusting to the new norm. A reminder to return any library books that may be overdue. The readers continue to be sanitised and cleaned, with thanks to our beautiful education support officers.

Our timetables for specialist classes have not changed since last term, therefore sport days remain the same. In addition, students are not required to wear hats during terms 2 and 3 but may continue to do so, if they wish.

Please remember that the drinking bubblers are unavailable for use at this time, however, the bottle fillers may be accessed. Please send a drink bottle with your child each day.

Literacy

Students continue to access readers in packs of five. Please return these at the end of each week for sanitising. Remember to incorporate reading as part of your routine at home. In class, we are currently learning about the styles and features of procedural writing and when it is used. In addition to this, we have been learning about proper and common nouns and the difference between these two parts of speech.

Numeracy

This week we are focusing on mental subtraction (subtracting in our head) and 'finding the difference' between two numbers. In addition to this, children have been revisiting 'time' and more specifically, telling time to o'clock and half past. This is a concept that can be difficult to develop unless it is revisited consistently. We ask that you incorporate this as much as possible at home, to consolidate learning.

Religious Education

The students have continued to discuss the creation that surrounds us, which has actually tied in quite nicely with our inquiry unit. This week they have focused on their role in preserving our natural environment and the difference they can make in caring for God's creation.

Inquiry

The students have been discussing what elements makes something 'living' or 'non-living' in our world. Some very interesting and constructive conversations have taken place whilst the students have attempted to classify objects into these two categories!!

YEAR THREE/FOUR – Karen, Nara, Ellie & Jess

Welcome to Week 8 of Term 2, the last week of remote learning. We hear many parents breathing a sigh of relief! Again, we would like to thank all our parents, grandparents and children for the positivity with which they have approached home learning. Even in these last days, please remember to guide your child/ren to carefully read and follow the daily message provided by their teacher. Whilst children should be given the responsibility of completing the daily allocated tasks, it is important for parents to guide this learning. Managing their time and taking on the responsibility of ensuring that tasks are submitted on time, are important skills that initially require lots of scaffolding by an adult. Keep up the great effort!

Upcoming Dates:

Monday 8th June - Queen's Birthday Holiday (No school)

Tuesday 9th June - Students 3-6 return to school to commence learning as usual.

Literacy:

This week in Reading, the children are listening, reading and comprehending a variety of texts including articles from Kids News, Reading Eggspress and Animal Tales by Tim Faulkner.

This week in Writing, the children are learning how to deconstruct the picture story book, 'Zizzy'. In a narrative deconstruction we pull apart a story into the elements of a narrative plan – Character and Setting descriptions, Sizzling Start, Backfill, Problem, Solution and Conclusion. Following on from this the children will deconstruct a picture story book of their choice.

Students are also practising and developing their handwriting and touch-typing skills. The spelling focus this week is the consonant digraph 'ch_' (as in chop) and '_ch' (as in bench, catch).

Maths:

This week, the students continue to develop an understanding of the different aspects of location and transformation. Each day, the learning begins with 20 minutes of Study Ladder PODs. These activities are related to the concepts covered in the main part of the daily Maths tasks. The following 40 minutes incorporates tasks related to the units, 'Slides and Turns' (on Monday & Tuesday) and 'Symmetry' (on Wednesday & Thursday).

Religion:

This week the children are demonstrating an understanding of the Fruits of the Holy Spirit by EITHER producing a music video; using Lego to create a Stop Motion Animation; filming themselves acting out a real-life experience; or creating a slideshow about the Fruits of the Holy Spirit.

Uniforms:

Just a reminder that children are to wear their winter uniforms on returning to school. Please ensure your child/ren has their name on all jumpers and jackets.

<u>YEAR FIVE/SIX – Andrea, Helen, Sharyn & James</u>

We are almost there! The last week of remote learning and then we will all be back at school next Tuesday. We can't wait to have everyone back learning and being together.

Upcoming Dates:

Tuesday June 9th - Students 3-6 return to school to commence learning as usual.

Technology Protocols -

Under the school's Acceptable Users Policy, students have been reminded of the following:

- 1. Emails outside of the 'spwangaratta' domain are NOT permitted.
- 2. Gmail accounts are to be used for learning only.
- 3. Conversations within Google Hangouts are NOT permitted.
- 4. Students are NOT to be unattended by a teacher within the Meeting Room.

Mathematics:

As students finish their measurement and geometry assignments, we will start to look at statistics and probability. The real-life context of the statistics unit relates to the Stolen Generation and Reconciliation Week. On our return the students' 3D model of their own design area will be showcased at school. We can't wait to see some of their designs.

Literacy:

The students are studying historical fiction and non-fiction texts in both reading and writing. This topic links in with the 5/6 Museums in Motion Inquiry and the set literacy tasks will form a part of the Museums in Motion Inquiry assignment. Students are also practising establishing opinions and writing persuasive pieces.

Inquiry:

After researching a significant Australian historical event, students will start to design and build a diorama. Students should be creative when planning their dioramas and use as many recycled materials as possible. They will bring their dioramas back into school next week and we will be holding a 'Museums in Motion' for the rest of the school community. More details to come.

RE:

Last week was National Reconciliation Week. The students completed tasks to help them understand and be a part of Reconciliation. The students will begin to learn about the celebration of Pentecost when they return to school next week. They will develop an understanding of the symbols of Pentecost and of the promise Jesus made to his disciples to carry on his mission.
