Well week two already. The holidays are just a memory. That said, the children seem to be enjoying school life once again. Lots of smiling faces and students who can't wait to catch up for a chat!


Opening School Mass – 14th February at 10.00am

CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSION FUND

CSEF will be provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities. To be eligible for the fund, a parent or legal guardian of a student attending a registered Government or non-government Victorian Primary or Secondary school must have a Health Care Card or Pension Card valid on the first day of school (January 29th, 2019). The allowance will be paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions, or sporting activities for the benefit of your child. Contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form or download from www.education.vic.gov.au/csef. A copy of your current Health Care Card is also needed upon application. Closing Date -You should lodge a CSEF application form at the school by Friday 5th April 2019.

A message from Dean Holley, Rural City of Wangaratta - unsafe parking around schools

We have already started receiving complaints regarding unsafe parking around our schools so would ask you to inform your parents/guardians of the need to comply with parking requirements.

Similar to last year we will be patrolling schools, both morning and afternoon, conducting enforcement for parking non-compliance.

We will be issuing warnings to those detected breaching parking requirements with those deemed to be parking in an "unsafe" manner being issued with an infringement. A moratorium on the issuing of infringements, except for those issued for unsafe parking, will be given until Monday 25 February, 2019.

Those parked in "No Stopping" areas will be deemed to be parked in an unsafe manner and will receive an infringement in the first instance. Anyone found parking in spaces reserved for those with valid disabled parking permits will also receive an infringement. There will be zero tolerance for these offences.

CHILDREN'S CHATTER MATTERS

In order to prepare for the language & learning demands of the school environment, children need ample time and opportunity to engage meaningful interactions with their family.

Research suggests that the types of questions we ask and the quality of discussions we have with our children, from a very young age, are linked to school success. As children progress through the grades they must learn to use extended discourse in telling stories, giving explanations, reporting, expressing an opinion or writing an essay. Asking children "if, why and how" type questions allows them to deepen their thinking and prepare longer and more complex responses. It makes sense to build their confidence with extended discourse gradually, beginning with simple oral tasks.

In each weekly newsletter this year, our school's Speech Pathologist will provide some "family friendly", fun oral language tasks aimed to enhance learning and literacy skills.

We encourage you to set some time aside each week so that you can get the most out of your interactions with your child. In a busy household, sometimes the car is the best place for these focused activities. The key ingredients for a creative interaction are a time, a place, a willing talking partner or audience and an engaging topic or activity.

If your child is reading a particular book at home or in class, try to incorporate words or ideas from that text into your activity. For example; if you are building your child's use of describing words, select a character from your child's reader to describe. Encourage increasingly expensive words such as the beautiful, gorgeous, stunning and breath-taking princess.

Positive communication experiences at home help children feel accepted and valued. Growth in spoken language skills will build children's self-confidence and help them learn to negotiate social interactions at school. This often transfers to other aspects of their learning and life.

Ten activities will be provided each term focusing on key areas of oral language supporting literacy, learning and socialising. Feel free to adjust these activities according to your child's grade level.

WHAT'S HAPPENING IN THE CLASSROOM

FOUNDATION - Caz & Trish

A warm welcome to St Patrick's from all of us in the Foundation area. We are very excited to be working alongside you this year and being a part of your child's learning journey.

We should all be very proud of the way the students have settled into school life and thank you for the wonderful way you have prepared and supported your child. It is amazing to see the independence in your child as they unpack their bag each day in readiness for their learning.

Wednesday 6th February - students do not attend school however, some students will come in for their assessment interview. Please ask us if you are unsure about which time you are booked in for.

Wednesday 13th February - students do not attend school however, some students will come in for their **assessment interview.**

Please ask us if you are unsure about which time you are booked in for.

Thursday 14th February - Opening School Mass 10.00am St Patrick's school - All families and friends are welcome. The children will sit with their class. The Foundation and Year 6 students will be a part of a traditional blessing song at the beginning of mass.

Wednesday 19th February - Parent Information Evening 7.00pm - 8.00pm in school hall

Wednesday 27th February - Reading Information afternoon - 2.45pm - 3.30pm in classroom

Wednesday 6th March - Reading Information evening 6.00pm - 7.00pm in classroom

Religion: We began our unit, 'What do we know about Jesus?' by discussing with the students what they already know about Jesus and what they want to know about him. The students will be able to share their insights into where they have seen or heard stories about Jesus. They will be encouraged to name the 'Bible' as a special book that tells us about Jesus' life.

Literacy: Big Books – Shaw - 'Brown Bear, Brown Bear, what do you see?' – Levesque - 'Grandpa, Grandpa'.

The students will enjoy listening and reading the big books each day. The students will focus on the starting point and the directionality when they read. The students will enjoy listening to many stories read throughout the day, as Mem Fox states, "If every parent understood the huge educational benefits and intense happiness brought about by reading aloud to their children, and if every parent and every adult caring for a child read aloud three stories a day to the children in their lives ,we would probably wipe out illiteracy in one generation". "Reading Magic Mem Fox" The students will focus on rhyming words. What words can you rhyme? What rhymes with your name? During writing the students will begin to 'write' and draw a message for others to read. They will focus on, 'What we write does not change.'

Reader bags: These are to come to school every day.

Mathematics: Our topic is 'Number and Place Value'. The students will connect number names to their quantities. The children will name, write and represent numbers in a variety of ways. The students will be encouraged to predict and represent numbers by using vocabulary such as e.g. 'more/less' and 'before/after'.

Sport: Students need to wear their sports uniform on Tuesdays and Thursdays.

Inquiry: We began our unit 'Developing the Learning Culture' by discussing what our classroom rules and routines look like. We will play games that encourage students to use the names of their classmates and discuss what "working together" looks and feels like.

Art Smock: Please bring in the art smocks and these will be kept in the classroom.

Hats: Please ensure your child brings their school hat to school. Please label your child's hat with their name. We thank you for your cooperation in this matter.

Literacy

Reading

- The children have been practising the daily routines of reading e.g. Take Home Books. These are meant to be read daily at home.
- The chosen book should be easily read at home as home reading is about practising. An easy way to check if a book is too hard is the five-finger test. If your child has trouble with five words on a page, then the book is too hard.
- Green take home bags must come to school each day along with the Reading Log which should be filled in daily.
- Ask your child lots of questions so as to develop comprehension strategies. This will build literal and inferred meaning. Some children can read texts fluently but are not able to answer questions related to the text.

Handwriting

- There will be a daily focus on handwriting, particularly on the correct formation of letters.
- We will continue to encourage correct pencil grip and paper position.

Writing

 We are currently looking at Recount where the children retell an event or something of interest.

Spelling

• Currently spelling is being drawn from the children's own writing.

Dictation

There will be a daily focus on dictation.

Revision of Number and Place Value

Physical Education

Mondays and Fridays this term

Rotations

The four classes rotate through four activities each Tuesday

<u>Library (David)</u> – This week we looked at the features of Fiction/Non-Fiction/Picture Story. The children enjoyed "Excuse Me" by Dave Hughes and discussed good manners

Italian (Janina) – Revision of greetings

STEM (Amanda) – an extension program. The children were engineers and had thirty minutes to read and follow instructions to create a paper chain.

<u>Inquiry (Karen)</u> – the children used Multiple Intelligences to show how they learn in different ways. This ties in with the current Mappen topic, "Developing our Learning Culture".

Literacy

Reading Focus: Connections and Summarising.

Writing Focus: Narrative. Students will be looking at planning a creative story using a 'Plan for Success template'. Students will look at the structure of a narrative story and share ideas about narrative stories that involve a problem and a solution.

Spelling Focus: *Magic e: a e* as in gate and spade.

This week your child has taken home their **reading log**. We encourage students to read at least 20 minutes each night. Could parents please ensure that they or their child fills in the reading log each day and brings it to school on the allocated day to be checked by their class teacher.

Numeracy:

This week the Year 3 and 4 students will be focusing on odd and even numbers. They will engage in a variety of games and tasks focused on assisting them to both determine and classify odd and even numbers.

Inquiry:

In our first unit, 'Developing Our Learning Culture', the students are exploring Habits of Mind, their own learning preferences and the social skills necessary to work effectively with others.

Religious Education:

Our first unit this term is 'Circle of Life'. Students will develop an understanding of what it means to be a Christian and how to share God's love with all. They will explore death and new life through stories, as well as discuss their own experiences and reflect on how Jesus is with them in times of sadness, loss and trouble.

Cyber Safety on Safer Internet Day

On Tuesday the students participated in an online Cyber Safety webinar ran by the Office of the eSafety Commission and the Department of Education. The students learnt how to be a digital super hero and how to use the Four Rs (Responsible, Respectful, Reasoning, Resilient) when online.

RRRR (Respectful, Relationships, Rights and Responsibilities)

This term the Years 5 and 6 will be focussing on Stress Management. The aims of this unit are to identify some causes of stress and strategies that can be used to reduce stress and to identify and explain factors that influence effective communication in a variety of situations. The evidence behind this unit states. 'Stress is a normal part of life, especially as children get older. Children who cope better with life's stressors develop good mental health and wellbeing. 10 Assisting students recognise their personal signs and symptoms of stress to develop strategies that will help them to deal with those effectively, will help them cope with challenges in the future' (RRRR, 2018).

Team Vic Registration Process

12 Years and Under

Registration to trial for most SSV 12 Years and Under Team Vic teams to compete in School Sport Australia Championships is done through an online process managed by the School Sport Unit.

Australian Football, Netball, Boys Football (Soccer), Boys Basketball and Girls Basketball differ due to the large number of students that register for this trial process. These sports start with nominations through their schools to enable attendance at Division trials as the first step. If selected at Division level a student will move through to Region trials except for basketball where a conference trial is held; and finally a State trial for possible selection in a Team Vic team.

To be eligible children registering to trial must be turning 10, 11 or 12 years of age in 2019.

SSV implements an online registration process for the five teams mentioned above across the State. This is done for the following reasons;

- It ensures all 12 Years and Under registrations to trial are done the same way.
- It ensures that regardless of where a child is and in what sector, primary or secondary, the process will be fair and equitable.
- It ensures the trial process attracts only students capable of performing at a high standard and is for emerging athletes who have reached a certain standard.

The Online Registration process will open on December 1, 2018 and close on March 1, 2019

Please be aware of the following;

- 1. On the SSV website it has been made clear that students need to consult with their Principal at school to ensure they have the skill level to trial and represent their school at a state level.
- 2. It is imperative that teachers will decide on your child's capability of representing their school at a state level trial.
- 3. This discussion with the school Principal is necessary as all students MUST get the Principal signature and School Stamp on their registration form prior to attending a trial.
- 4. Registration is a NON-REFUNDABLE \$25 fee. This fee will be for the cost of hosting the trial and subsequent expenses as well as an administration fee.



- 5. This Registration is a registration for a Division trial. Confirmation to attend a trial will occur after registration closes and before the end of Term 1, 2019.
- 6. Once registered, you will receive an email confirming payment and a form which will require the Principal's signature. This form must be handed in to the Division Trial Coordinator on the day. NO FORM, NO TRIAL. If you do not receive this email contact School Sport Victoria immediately. School.sport.victoria@edumail.vic.gov.au
- 7. Once registration for Division trials close on March 1, 2019, Division Coordinators will email the registered participants and inform them of the time, date and venue for their trial before the end of Term 1, 2019.
