WHAT'S HAPPENING IN THE CLASSROOM

FOUNDATION – Caz, Karen & Trish

It is unbelievable to think it is December! Summer is here, which means Christmas is around the corner and the school year is nearly over!

THANK YOU for YOUR GENEROSITY to the St Vincent De Paul Christmas appeal. We had many packets of cheezels and mince pies that were brought to school last week. Thank you. You all have been invited to the Foundation classes Reader's Theatre this Tuesday and Thursday. It is an opportunity for the students to read a fairy tale to an audience.

Religion

This week the students begin the unit 'We celebrate Christmas'. The students will learn that Advent is a time for waiting and preparing for the birth of Jesus. They will discuss 'waiting' and how they feel about waiting for things.

Literacy

This is the last week the students will read and discuss a Fairy Tale. This week, the Foundation classes will focus on -Foundation Shaw - Three Billy Goats Gruff Foundation Bray - Gingerbread Man Foundation Levesque - Jack and the Beanstalk

Mathematics

This week, the students will revise their understanding of place value and continue to count forwards and backwards from various numbers. They will read, order and make numbers. Game - Roll two dice or turn over two cards. Say the number. What number is one more, one less? (Extension - Use three/four dice. Add ten/hundred or take ten/hundred from the number rolled)

Inquiry

As a part of our unit 'Great and Small', the students will consider how places change and how we need to adapt to these changes. Through time lapse videos, the students will view the changes that occur in the life of a monarch caterpillar such as: chewing a hole in the egg, wiggling out of the egg, eating leaves to get bigger and becoming a caterpillar.

The students will be asked to consider what they might see during each season. They will link the seasons to changes in animals and consider what they are differently.

YEAR ONE/TWO – Janina, Amanda, David, Fran & Erin

What a wonderful night we had at Twilight Sports last Wednesday, thank you to all the families that were able to join us and watch their children participate. We had a very informative and interesting visit from Christian Overberg, paramedic and father of Tom (1CG) on Wednesday, giving us an insight into the role paramedics play in keeping our community safe and healthy. Could all library books please be returned this week to avoid receiving a fine for overdue books. At this time of the year we need to ensure that the children are rested and ready for a busy countdown until the end of the year. There have been a lot of children coming to school tired at the beginning of the day which makes for a very long day.

LITERACY

Year One

Reading: We are looking at '**inferring**' as a strategy to help us comprehend while reading again using great picture story books.

Writing: We are continuing to look at Persuasive writing and the different forms it can take. The children will have an opportunity to express an opinion and do their best to persuade others through their persuasive writing pieces.

Spelling: We are revising some of the sound blends that we have looked at throughout the year and high frequency words.

Year Two

Reading: An emphasis on using appropriate expression, eg pitch and pause, and attending to punctuation. They will also continue to use comprehension strategies to build literal and inferred meaning to expand content knowledge, integrating and linking ideas and analysing and evaluating texts.

Writing: We will continue to revise correct choice and consistent use of pronouns throughout writing. In handwriting we are revising the correct formation of letter 'Jj'.

Spelling: We are looking at '**y**' words as in pony and looking at these words within our everyday reading.

MATHS

Year One - This week in Numeracy we will continue to do lots of revision work in the areas of Number and Algebra, Measurement and Geometry and Statistics and Probability.

Year Two - The children will be reading and interpreting calendars and continuing to explore similarities and differences between the months.

RELIGION

This week in Religion we continue our work on Advent. We look at the story of Mary's visit to Elizabeth. (Luke 1:39-47;56) and then role play this story with a partner. We also look at the Advent Wreath and discuss the 4 candles and how they represent something different each week of Advent.

INQUIRY

We continue to focus on 'People and Places in our Community'. The children have been working on completing a 'Birds eye view' of their community of Wangaratta with a focus on including all of those important places such as the Police Station, Fire Station, Newspaper and Library, some of which we were fortunate enough to visit during the Term.

Religious Education:

Over the next three weeks the students will explore the unit, 'Christmas the Message of Joy and Peace'. The students will develop their understanding of Christmas as a time to celebrate the birth of Jesus Christ and that it is a time of sharing joy and peace to the wider community. This week starts with our first Advent liturgy followed by creative activities related to the definition of Christmas, peace, joy and how we celebrate Christmas.

Literacy:

Reading

Students look at information about our Neighbouring Countries from Inquiry. They will first read information about their selected country and where it is situated. Students will highlight key words from the information they have read.

Writing:

Revise the difference between dot points and writing sentences when reading/listening to information. The students will then listen to an information report about one of Australia's neighbouring countries. After discussing key words, they will write down dot points and then turn them into sentences using their own words.

Spelling:

This week in spelling the students are looking at words from our Inquiry unit, 'Our Island Home', finding their meanings, put them into sentences and also use them in their information report.

THANK YOU ATHLETE'S FOOT FOR SUPPORTING OUR SCHOOL

Numeracy:

This week we are looking at 'Location' and 'Mapping'. The students will create and interpret maps to show position and pathways. They will learn to use simple scales, legends and directions to interpret information contained in basic maps.

Inquiry:

This week in Inquiry, the students are naming, creating and designing their 'island home'. It will include designing a flag, a coat of arms, writing a national anthem, finding a location and describing the island's climate and weather. It should be fun!!

Food for thought: as there is a change in this term's timetable with the middle block being longer, it might be a good idea to pack an extra piece of fruit or sandwich for that extra bit of energy!! Also, with the weather warming up, please ensure your child has a water bottle. Thank you!!

YEAR FIVE/SIX – Nara, Paul, Andrea, Helen, Sharyn

Literacy/ Inquiry

In Reading this week students are continuing to learn to think critically about different types of text. They are using a variety of non-fiction texts to develop an understanding of the different genres and special forms within the larger category of non-fiction texts. Students are also learning how to express their reasoning relative to a writer's purpose in selecting a particular genre`, topic, subject or type of narrative structure.

This week, writing and Inquiry are combined as students are preparing their PowerPoint business plan presentations. This will include an explanation of the product or service they are providing, how the product or service will be marketed and potentially sold, as well as data obtained and analysed from the market research surveys.

Numeracy:

Over the course of the next week, students will be continuing to develop their understanding of measurement through a variety of hands on learning experiences. This will include:

- calculating the perimeter and area of rectangles.
- converting between different units of measurements.
- measuring/ calculating mass, volume and capacity.

Religious Education

This week students are working on a new unit called 'What was the Message of John the Baptist?'. In this unit students will explore some of the readings of the season of Advent, specifically focusing on how John the Baptist answered the call of God to proclaim the promise of the Saviour and challenge individuals to conversion. Students will be guided to compare this to a modern day 'John the Baptist', an individual who challenges them to deepen their understanding of the Good News and calls them to participate more fully in the life of the Church through their own words and actions.

Social Emotional Learning (Rights, Responsibilities and Respectful Relationships)

We are continuing to focus on 'Gender and Identity'. Our students are analysing '...the impact of peer and adult actions in maintaining or changing contemporary gender norms; developing an awareness of the impact of gender norms on the attitudes and behaviours of those entering adolescence; identifying the standards and associated actions that underpin respectful gender relations.' (Resilience, Rights and Respectful Relationships p. 64)


