Here is a man who is born of Jewish parents, the child of a peasant woman.

Primary school attendance

Going to school every day is the single most important part of your child's education. Students learn new things at school every day – missing school puts them behind.

Why it's important

We all want our students to get a great education, and the building blocks for a great education begin with students coming to school each and every day.

If students miss school regularly, they miss out on learning the fundamental skills that will set them up for success in the later years of school.

There is no safe number of days for missing school – each day a student misses puts them behind, and can affect their educational outcomes.

Each missed day is associated with progressively lower achievement in numeracy, writing and reading.

Getting in early

Attendance patterns are established early – a child regularly missing days in kindergarten or in the early years of school will often continue to miss classes in the later years, and receive lower test scores than their classmates. It's vital that students go to school every day – even in the early years of primary school.

What we can do

The main reasons for absence are:

Sickness – There are always times when students need to miss school, such as when they're ill. It's vital that they're only away on the days they are genuinely sick, and setting good sleep patterns, eating well and exercising regularly can make a big difference.

It's vital that holidays are planned during school holidays where possible, and not during the term if it can be avoided.

"Day off" – Think twice before letting your child have a "day off" as they could fall behind their classmates – every day counts.

Truancy – This is when students choose not to go to school without their parent's permission. There can be many reasons for truancy. The best way to address this is for schools and parents to work together.

If for any reason your child must miss school, there are things you can do with your school to ensure they don't fall behind:

 Speak with your classroom teacher and find out what work your child needs to do to keep up. Develop an absence learning plan with your teacher and ensure your child completes the plan.

Remember, every day counts. If your child must miss school, speak with your classroom teacher as early as possible.

Openly communicating with your child's school about all absences is a good way to prevent attendance issues being escalated to a School Attendance Officer. A School Attendance Officer is a Department of Education and Training Regional Director who has authority to follow up attendance issues. Attendance issues that are escalated can lead to an Infringement Notice.

If you're having attendance issues with your child, please let your classroom teacher know so we can work together to get your child to school every day.

Religion

This week we continue the unit, 'We Celebrate Christmas'. Literacy:

Reading – This week students are reading and studying a range of Christmas poems to help raise the Christmas spirit while learning about different forms of poetry and the wide array of literary devices they use. Some of the literary devices, students are looking for in the Christmas poems include; alliteration, rhyming, metaphors, similes, personification and repetition.

Writing – The 3/4 students are developing their own Christmas Poetry Books as a part of this week's studies into Poetry. Each day they will focus on writing in a particular form of poetry and will learn about the features and rules associated with each form. Students will be learning specifically about haiku's, acrostic poems, limericks, cinquains and colour poems. They will then draft, edit and publish their own Christmas poems in each of these forms into their very own Christmas Poetry Books.

Spelling – This week for spelling students are looking at words which have a change to their basic spelling to become plural. Here are the plural words for this week: mice, women, gentlemen, geese, men, teeth, oxen, children and lice.

Numeracy: This week students are continuing to develop their understanding of multiplication and division using both concrete materials and written strategies. They will draw on the multiplication tables as they solve a range of problems. Please continue to encourage and support your child's automatic recall of the multiplication tables facts at home.

Religious Education: This week the students are continuing learning activities and tasks through the unit, 'Christmas the Message of Joy and Peace'. They will develop their understanding of Christmas as a time to celebrate the birth of Jesus Christ and that it is a time of sharing joy and peace to the wider community.

Homework: This week for homework students can practise their automatic recall of the multiplication tables facts.

Students are also expected to read 15-20 minutes each night and discuss the text they have read with an adult.

River Detectives Excursion December 7th 2020

On Monday Izzy, Evie, Archer, Eva, Mia, Henry and Hayley went down to the Ovens River for a one-off session with Kathie Le Busque, who is the River Detectives Coordinator for North East CMA. Kathie's session with us focused on new techniques on how to sample for macroinvertebrates, also teaching us more ways to help us how to identify the macroinvertebrates.

We found multiple exquisite macroinvertebrate species including glass shrimp, water striders, backswimmers, water boatman and mayfly nymphs. Macroinvertebrate sampling helps us understand if our waterway is healthy or not. We really enjoyed the experience and feel lucky to have had Kathie share her expertise with us.
