# Reconciliation

This week, some of our students celebrated the Sacrament of Reconciliation. The word Reconciliation is used in a number of ways, but there are two that stand out for me: as a Sacrament in the Catholic Church and the process of Reconciliation and Healing with our Indigenous brothers and sisters.

There are many similarities between the two.

The Sacrament of Reconciliation calls us to reflect on our lives and make right the things that we do that are at odds with God's love for us by the way that we treat others. It is always important to say sorry for past wrongs so that we can move forward with a fresh start, leaving past wrongdoings (sins) behind.

In the same way with the process of Reconciliation with our Aboriginal brothers and sisters. We must acknowledge the wrongdoings and seek forgiveness so that we can move forward together in harmony with each other.

The Sacrament of Reconciliation is about forgiving and being forgiven. It marks a point in a person's faith journey. What it's not, is some magic moment where we gain enlightenment by the conferring of the Sacrament. Instead, it gives us insight to continue to grow to be the loving people that we were created to be.

Our greatest gift from God, I think, is our ability to love. It is something that all people are universally capable of and it leads us to help make the world a better place.

# Report Writing Day – Postponed

The Report Writing Day set down this Friday (11<sup>th</sup> June) has been put back until later in the year. This was done so that we could avoid a closure day so close to the last lockdown.

## Reports and Parent/Teacher Interviews

Reports will now be sent out on Friday, 16<sup>th</sup> July, and NOT on the last day of term (25<sup>th</sup> June) as previously advertised. This is due to the cancellation of the Report Writing day and the need to give teachers more time. Reports will now be published on Friday before our Parent/Teacher interviews.



As a staff, we have discussed what these interviews might look like. Staff mentioned that, last year, some parents were happy to have a telephone call (due to COVID) and the decision was made to make a telephone call or Face-To-Face available to parents, given the fluidity of the current COVID situation.

Parents will still need to book a time (when the booking site opens) and, by leaving their phone number in the box provided, teachers will know that your preference is contact by phone. If you leave the telephone section blank or "na" then we will presume that you will come into school for a face-to-face meeting with your child's teacher.

# Current COVID 19 Protocols

In compliance with government regulations, we would ask that parents refrain from entering school if possible. You are certainly allowed to enter the office, providing that social distancing and capacity requirements are met. I would prefer students to be picked up from the gate. If there are issues of anxiety (etc) then certainly speak with me or your child's teacher, and we will look to modifying the general rule so that it best meets the needs of those individuals.

As mentioned in the letter that I emailed to parents the other day, if you need to bring your child into school, then you MUST wear a mask and check in with the QR code (irrespective of how long that you remain onsite).

#### Show and Tell:

#### **Religion:**

Our unit for the rest of Term 2 is, 'I Care For God's World'.

In this unit, students are appreciating and expressing wonder at God's creation. They have been introduced to the fact that they have certain responsibilities to live in harmony with creation. Through our daily prayers, we have shared and given thanks for God's wonderful world.

#### Literacy:

Big Books:	Mrs Patterson	- Mrs Wishy Washy and the Big Wash'.
	Mrs Shaw	- 'The Jigaree'.

#### **Reading Focus:**

- 'I can segment and blend the sounds in simple words' E.g. red, spot, at, black, ship.
- 'I can read some sight words automatically' E.g. here, come, me, my, go, in, to, up.

• Reading predictable texts, practising phrasing and fluency, and monitoring meaning using concepts about print.

#### Writing Focus:

• Know that spoken sounds and words can be written down using letters of the alphabet and how to <u>write</u> some high-frequency sight words and known words.

- Know how to use onset and rime to spell words.
- Produce some lowercase and uppercase letters using learned letter formations.

Most students are now hearing and recording the beginning and ending sounds in words when writing, using words around the room to write some sight words correctly and are able to write on the lines in a left to right direction. We have been focussing heavily on using spaces between words in sentences to enable us to read what we are writing about.

#### Mathematics:

This week the students will continue to explore Number and Place Value. They will continue to learn many new card and dice games to develop their mathematical understanding. We will continue to explore numbers 0 - 10 and the many ways each number can be partitioned. E.g. 5 can be 0&5, 1&4, 2&3. 8 can be 2&6, 4&4, 3&5. Children will work toward developing automatic recall of all the ways numbers 1-10 can be partitioned. We explore this through the use of visuals, ten frames, counters, dominoes and share ways we can record this information. We have also been looking at using the vocabulary 'one more' and 'one less' when discussing numbers to 100.

#### Inquiry (MAPPEN): 'Our Sustainable World'

In this unit they will be exploring the conditions required for sustaining the environment. The students will draw a picture of what our environment should look like. They will write a statement about how we are responsible for the environment.

#### 4R's Program (Rights, Resilience and Respectful Relationships):

This week the students will continue to name and celebrate personal strengths as well as what personal strengths we could work on.

#### YEAR ONE/TWO – Karen, Caz & Sarah

A big welcome back to our Year 1/2 students. We are so very thankful that we can go back to a little bit of normality. All the Year 1/2 teachers would like to say a massive thank you for your support with your child's Remote Learning last week.

Due to remote learning last week, we as a school have decided that next Friday 11th of June <u>will</u> <u>not</u> be a pupil free day/report writing day.

#### **Religion -**

This week in Religion we will be continuing our unit of Sacraments with special celebrations. Our focus this week will be to discuss signs of love, e.g. hugs and kisses, a loving home, food, actions, gifts, clothing, care, concern, demonstrating and teaching. Students will illustrate signs of love that they experience in real life situations.

#### Numeracy -

This week in Numeracy we will continue on with our topic Length, which we did not get to finish due to remote learning. Students will be given a number of opportunities to look at different forms of measurement and where we can use them in everyday life. At home you could discuss and compare items in your house and their differences.

Towards the end of the week students will be conducting an AFL investigation, where students are given posed questions using the terms 'likely' and 'unlikely'. From that investigation students will then gather their data and present this in a graph form.

#### Literacy -

During our Literacy sessions this week students will be continuing to explore the Epic app in order to find their own non-fiction book to assist with their writing. Students will have the opportunity to find their own book that works with their interest and hobbies. This could include reading all about Ponies. Our phoneme this week is 'er' as in teacher, 'ar' as in collar, 'or' as in doctor, 'ure' as in measure, 'a' as in zebra. The students will be creating lists with this phoneme and find words with this spelling when reading.

#### Book Fair -

This week we will be holding our Book Fair in our school Library. Each 1/2 have time at the start of the week to view the books and maybe write a wish list. Towards the end of the week students will be given an opportunity on their given day to go and purchase their books. If parents wish to view our book fair could they please speak to either Annette or Mrs Pane in the school office.

#### Inquiry -

We will discuss all the different ways we use water in our everyday lives. The students will also think about the ways water is wasted and discuss how we can save water.

#### RRRR

Before students were forced into remote learning, they each discussed their strengths with their peers. This week students will share with the group how they have used these strengths or where they have seen others use them. They may even like to share a new strength they feel they have.

#### YEAR THREE/FOUR – Karen, Nara, Ellie & Janina

#### **Important Dates:**

#### Thursday 17th June - School Photos

#### Inquiry & Literacy:

Students will be working in cross-class pairs to commence their investigation of endangered animals that are linked to conservation organisations. Using the WWF Species Directory, students will select their endangered animal and over the next two weeks they will research information relating to their animal's conservation status, population, habitat, threats and conservation campaigns.

During Literacy sessions (Reading and Writing), students will be learning how to search for, and interpret the information related to their chosen animal, and they will also develop their note-taking skills using digital technology (Notes App).

#### Spelling focus:

-ure as in lure, in addition to alternative phoneme/grapheme choices such as, -our (detour) and - ewer (fewer).

#### Mathematics:

This week we are focussing on fractions of a collection (for example, 1/3 of 24 = 8), and demonstrating that the denominator tells us how many groups that a particular collection is divided into. We are also learning how to represent fractions on number lines through a variety of hands on tasks.

#### Homework:

We have not scheduled any homework tasks this week, however all students have been encouraged to read each night (either to an adult or independently), and to discuss their reading with an adult.

#### **Religious Education:**

Our focus in Religious Education moves to the last Sacrament of Initiation, Eucharist. In this unit we will focus on developing students' understanding that Eucharist is a special meal recalling the events of the Last Supper. We will also reflect on Jesus' presence when we celebrate Eucharist: in the community which comes together to worship; in the priest who presides in Jesus' name; in Scripture; and in the blessed bread and wine.

Please remember as per Terry's email that for this week if students could be picked up from the gate where possible. If there are other reasons to enter the school, then parents will need to wear a mask and register using the QR code (located around the school). Parents are not to enter classrooms at this stage please.

#### Religion: WHO IS JESUS IN LUKE'S GOSPEL?

This week students will be exploring some of the images of Jesus as presented in Luke's gospel, as well as Jesus' special concern for the marginalised. Students will examine the way in which Luke illustrates the pattern of Christian life and explore how the values and themes of this Gospel can be applied to their own lives.

#### Maths:

In maths this week students will familiarise themselves with 'The Bar Model Method'. This method is used to solve mathematical word problems involving whole numbers and fractions and is primarily a problem-solving tool, a way of organising information from a word problem or other problems set in a context, and an efficient tool for visualising relationships between known and unknown quantities.

#### Literacy:

This week we will be paying particular attention to fiction texts and thinking within, beyond and about the texts read either independently, as a group or as a whole class. We will also continue our work on antonyms and synonyms as well as focusing on ensuring we maintain consistency in our tenses when writing.

#### Inquiry: THINK GLOBAL, ACT LOCAL

The students are continuing to research information on their chosen country and extreme weather event. This research has assisted children to highlight key information and paraphrase in their own words. Students are working towards creating a keynote presentation on their chosen event and we look forward to sharing these with our families in the coming weeks.

It has been great to see students taking responsibility for their own learning and completing these homework tasks each week. Homework is due each FRIDAY.



Most social media networks have rules banning cyberbullying and have complaints tools for reporting.

If you need to report serious on-line bullying of a child under the age of 18 years these are the steps to follow.

- Take screen shots for evidence, record the date and time on the screen shots taken. Save these.
- Block the bully on whatever social media app is being used.
- Report the cyberbully to the relevant social media platform. Be aware that some social media sites take up to 48hrs to remove the reported post. You MUST report through this channel first.
- If the post is not removed, report it to the Office of the eSafety Commissioner via the complaints section found at esafety.gov.au.
- If the bullying is threatening someone's life or there is image based abuse taking place, immediately contact your local police station.
