Expectations For Students

- Provide resources and equipment to assist teaching and learning;
- Ensure curriculum provides for the needs of all students with a range of needs; &

School Actions & Consequences

St. Patrick's Primary School runs a student behaviour management and student discipline framework based The Four R's - Resilience, Rights and Respectful Relationships.

School Rules: St. Patrick's has three school rules that govern the expectations and behaviour of students. The students use these simple rules to learn how they should behave in different areas of the school. The students have agreed on expected behaviours in different areas of the school. These are displayed in the relevant areas of the school and are also displayed in their classrooms.

Positive rewards:

St Patrick's Student Of The Week- Every week each teacher chooses a 'Student of the Week' from their class. The student and the reason for them receiving the award are included in the weekly newsletter. They also receive a certificate at the following weeks assembly.
