The children who have prepared for the Eucharist and Confirmation Sacrament are still waiting for a date to celebrate these Sacraments. The Sacramental team met earlier this month and decided to wait until early next year in the hope restrictions will be lifted further, allowing the children to share the celebration with their families.

No Lunch Orders

Speaking with our suppliers of lunch orders, a decision has been made to not proceed with supplying lunch orders for the remainder of this year. The business is currently undergoing some changes and requires time to re-establish itself. Hopefully they will resume next year.

Just checking - Email addresses

School Hats

During term four school hats are required to be worn outside as part of the school's Sunsmart Policy. Students who do not have a hat will be restricted to play under the pavilion at school to protect them from the sun. Hats need to be sun safe (baseball style caps are not permitted).

Face Masks

We ask that parents send their child to school with a face mask if they are in Years 3 to 6. Please make sure that they are appropriately marked as they are only required to be worn indoors and the students are not required to wear them during recess/lunch times whilst outdoors (unless they choose to do so).

The school has a limited number of masks to supply to students who lose or break theirs whilst at school to ensure that we maintain a standard.

New Face Mask Regulations

We have received new directives from the Victorian Chief Health Officer regarding the wearing of face masks at school for Primary aged students (Years 3 to 6). I have included the relevant directives from the current government guidelines (below).

- 1. Please see coronavirus.vic.gov.au for the latest face mask requirements. For all school settings, the Victorian Chief Health Officer Directs:
- students in Year 3 to Year 6 to wear face masks when indoors on school premises, unless an exception applies
- Recommends that all other children wear face masks when at school, attending an OSHC program, or when travelling to and from school on public transport, taxis or ride share vehicles. There are a number of lawful reasons for not wearing a face mask, including for staff and students who are unable to wear a face mask due to the nature of their disability, medical or a mental health condition.

A face mask must cover the nose and mouth. Face shields, scarves or bandanas do not meet these requirements.

We ask that parents send their child to school with a face mask if they are in Years 3 to 6. Please make sure that they are appropriately marked as they are only required to be worn indoors and the students are not required to wear them during recess/lunch times whilst outdoors (unless they choose to do so).

Current COVID Restrictions for Schools

Just a reminder to parents that you can only come onto the school site for essential reasons. If you are dropping your child off it is preferable that you do this at one of the school gates - Ovens St and Ryley St.

If you do need to come into any of the school buildings, <u>you must enter through the front office and check in, regardless of the time spent in the building.</u>

YOU MUST WEAR A MASK AT ALL TIMES

PLEASE do not enter any of the classrooms through the school grounds.

Outside of School Hours Care (OSHC) Parents may enter the school via the Ovens St Gate to collect their child/ren from child care. They are only permitted to the front entrance of the hall to sign their child out. A mask must be worn at all times please.

School Operations Guide

The latest school Operations guidelines require that:

- Hand hygiene and cleaning regimes are in place
- Visitors are restricted to staff and health and wellbeing support with record keeping
- No assemblies or liturgies
- Libraries can be open
- Shared drink taps open
- Sports programs are permitted with conditions

COVID Action Unwell Students

Families are asked to keep students exhibiting symptoms similar to cold and flu at home until the symptoms go or they have been cleared by a doctor. It is important that we are all vigilant when it comes to spotting potential problems with COVID 19.

WHAT'S HAPPENING IN THE CLASSROOM

FOUNDATION - Trish & Grace

Welcome to Week 6! We can't believe how quickly the weeks are flying. The students continue to work hard to fully consolidate their learning. Please continue to keep a regular reading routine happening at home please. We know this time of the year gets busy but it is so important for the students to keep reading regularly.

Last week the students wrote letters to Santa - we are hoping he writes a return letter to our classes! Today we went to the Post Office to post the letters. We have also made a copy of these letters for the children to bring home. There was lots of excitement in anticipation of a response from Santa!

There will be an excursion form and details coming home shortly, if not already for our Junior Swimming Program at Moore Than Swimming.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION:

This week, we begin our unit, 'We Celebrate Christmas'. In this unit students will explore the celebration of Jesus' birth and explore the concept of waiting and preparing for special events in our lives. They will have an understanding of waiting and how it applies to their lives. They will be led to appreciate that Mary and Joseph waited for the birth of Jesus. They will be encouraged to relate their experiences of giving, receiving and celebrating to this important liturgical event. It will be reinforced that the Bible contains many stories that tell us about Jesus' life on earth. The students have reflected on how they share the celebration of Christmas with their families.

LITERACY:

Thank you for continuing to read with your child every day, it really shows when this is a regular routine and reflects in the classroom. When reading, we have been concentrating on rereading for comprehension with a particular focus on predicting as well as noticing when our reading doesn't sound right. It is important for students to discuss the text as they read, in order to understand what they have read. As well as explicit writing instruction, we have also been observing and monitoring students to see what they are able to write independently. They particularly enjoyed writing their letters to Santa.

SHOW AND TELL: Week 6 Favourite Song

MATHS:

This week we have continued to consolidate all Counting and Place Value skills required for Foundation Level. We also extend on these skills, for those students who are ready to do so. This is delivered through a variety of problem solving tasks, interactive games and communication in regards to strategies used to solve problems. The students have been ordering two, three, four and five digit numbers in order from smallest to largest. They have also been learning how to read numbers; beginning with two digit numbers and moving beyond, based on current skill level. Numbers with an internal zero have also been a focus for reading and writing. E.g. 305, 450, 4056, 3506 etc. They have also been making numbers using concrete materials and exploring through many calculator tasks. We continue to practice counting by 2s, 5s and 10s starting from 0.

Religion-

This week in Religious Education we will continue the unit, 'Our Call to Mission.' This week the students will view and listen to many stories about kindness. The students will create a 'Kindness Box' with messages that can be shared with others such as self-affirmation, kindness and gratitude, thinking about what Jesus has taught us to think, say and do.

Literacy-

This week in Literacy students will continue to look at Fairy Tales e.g. 'The Three Little Pigs', 'Hansel and Gretel', 'Henny Penny'. Students will be given a number of opportunities to respond to the stories they are hearing. One of the responses students will be asked to do will be changing the ending or changing the characters.

This week's phoneme is 'oo' as in mood, roof, broom, noon, hoop, soup,boot, feud etc. Students will continue to work in their reading groups focusing on fluency and ensuring that they are pausing when required and using punctuation to help them read.

Mathematics-

This week in Mathematics the students will be completing the topic on Money, then moving onto Volume and Capacity. Students will work on the differences between the two concepts then complete a variety of activities using different containers and objects to learn to measure correctly.

4 R's/Inquiry

As we were unable to complete our rotations last week due to such a short week, the students will complete the rotation activities this week.

4 R's

The students will work through team games. The students will then reflect on these questions: -

- 1. How do you know when it is good to follow a leader and when it is not?
- 2. What should we do when our friend is starting to lead an activity that is unfair, hurtful or mean?
- 3. What can we do when we hear someone using mean gender names like, 'Boys can't play this game! Girls can't do that!'?

Inquiry-

Students will continue to look at ways people plan out how to build items or objects. They will look at the process of organising materials that serve a purpose and what amount they will need.

Homework:

This week we are beginning homework tasks again for our Year 3/4 students. Homework includes two articles for students to read and respond to by writing questions related to the content. Students also have a multiplication game to complete as a mathematics task for the week.

Literacy:

In Writing, students have continued with the study of 'Script Writing' with a particular focus on the features of play scripts. They have begun to compose a script for a scene from their own story plan or borrowed from a book of their choice. These scripts will then be used in the filming of student's own short animation films. In Reading, students are continuing to complete a range of comprehension activities which include exploring and responding to the media platforms Kids News, Behind the News (BTN) and Tim Faulkner's Animal Tales.

Inquiry:

Students are continuing with their 'Frame by Frame' Inquiry unit. This week, the students have continued to work on creating a storyboard for their scene of choice and are incorporating their ideas for characters, settings and props. Our Digital Technology studies have worked alongside our inquiry and have begun to prepare the students for the use of coding or stop motion animation in their films. Our Google Computer Science lessons are helping students learn how they can incorporate good dialogue with figurative language to create interesting characterisation in their films.

Spelling:

Our focus phoneme this week is the consonant sound that is produced by the following graphemes: 'p' and 'pp' as in expect and opposite. We are also focusing on differentiating between various homophones and reviewing high frequency words with irregular spelling patterns that can often be spelled incorrectly.

Mathematics:

This week Year 3/4 classes are investigating more written multiplication strategies. Students have been exploring the use of the split strategy, the grid strategy or vertical multiplication in solving multiplication problems which include numbers with 2 or more digits. For example, the split strategy can be used to help solve 45×3 . First expand the number into 40 and 5, then multiply each by 3. $40 \times 3 = 120$, and $5 \times 3 = 15$. Then we add these products together; 120 + 15 = 135, this solves our original problem 45×3 .

Religious Education:

In our unit <u>'Jesus Models Forgiveness'</u>, this week the students will be looking at the three Rites of Reconciliation, the prayers and actions. We will learn the Prayer of Sorrow together and will think about ways of rewriting the prayer into language and words for today. Many students in our classes

are learning the prayer together in preparation for their celebration of the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Students in class will also have the opportunity to write an Acrostic poem form about forgiveness.

Uniform:

In Term 4 hats are compulsory for students to wear when outdoors at school. Please ensure your child has a St Patrick's hat with them in their bag, for school. Students are required to wear their full summer uniform. Please ensure that all uniform items are clearly labelled with your child's name.

Masks:

Students in Year 3 and above are asked by the Victorian Government to bring in masks from home to wear in class. We ask that parents please check to see if their children have a mask ready each day for school as we are finding that many students have misplaced or forgotten their masks. Thank you to those who are helping us to follow this Government mandate.

Literacy:

In Writing we have been working on exposition texts. Students have been working on writing a Sizzling Start which grabs the attention of the reader as soon as they start reading. We will continue working on these for the next couple of weeks.

Numeracy:

In Maths this week we are looking at the Cartesian plane and how to plot points using the X and Y axis. Students have learnt about the quadrants, positive and negative integers. We have also been measuring the distance between points and translating shapes using coordinates.

Inquiry:

This week students have been busy making a prototype of the product they are going to sell at our Bizarre Bazaar market. We will then have a look at what worked well with our product and the areas we could improve before we make our final products in the coming weeks. We would love some help from the school community with gathering items to use for our creations. If you have any of these items spare at home we would love donations!
