

Syllable Counting

Syllable awareness is an early phonological awareness skill which forms the foundation for emergent literacy skills. Syllable awareness is the skill of hearing the sounds within words and recognising that words can be broken into syllables or word parts. Listening to compound words (e.g. classroom) and breaking them up into their word parts is a great way to start. The skill requires counting, tapping, blending (e.g. kan-ga-roo = kangaroo) or segmenting words into their word parts.

Rhyme Awareness

Rhyme awareness is another early phonological awareness skill which builds emergent literacy skills. Rhyming requires children to listen closely for sounds within words. Children who recognise rhyme realise that words are made up of separate parts. Rhyming words are words which have the same ending sound, regardless of spelling.

Sound Identification

Identifying the individual sounds within words is an important phonological awareness skill for literacy development. Being able to identify the sounds which make up words is critical for being able to blend sounds together when reading and also segment the sounds when spelling.

Onset & Rime

Onset and Rime is an early phonological awareness skill which helps children recognise common 'chunks' within words and patterns between words and word families. Onset and rime knowledge helps children decode new words when reading and form spelling strategies.

Sound Deletion

Sound deletion is a later phonological awareness skill typically acquired between grade 1 and grade 2 which is the ability to identify how a word would sound if one sound was omitted (e.g. from either the beginning or ending of a word). This is a crucial skill in decoding new words and understanding word families.

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CSEF ELIGIBILITY

Below are the criteria used to determine a student's eligibility for the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF).

Criteria 1 - General eligibility

To be eligible for the fund, a parent or carer of a student attending a registered Government or non-government Victorian primary or secondary school must:

- · on the first day of Term one
- · on the first day of Term two
- a) be a holder of one or more of the eligible financially-means tested cards OR be a temporary foster parent, and;
- b) submit an application to the school by the due date.

For the list of eligible financially-means tested cards refer to the CSEF Policy: https://www2.education.vic.gov.au/pal/camps-sports-and-excursions-fund/policy

Parents who receive a Carer Allowance on behalf of a child, or any other benefit or allowance not income tested by Centrelink, are not eligible for the CSEF unless they also comply with the above.

Criteria 2 - Be of school age and attend school in Victoria

For the purposes of CSEF, students may be eligible for assistance if they attend a Victorian registered primary or secondary school. CSEF is not payable to students attending pre-school, kindergarten, home schooled, or TAFE.

Special Consideration

A special consideration category exists for

- Families on a bridging visa, temporary protection visa, in community detention or are asylum seeker families
- Students in temporary out of home care arrangements, including statutory kinship care

Eligibility Date

For concession card holders CSEF eligibility will be subject to the parent/carer concession card being validated successfully with Centrelink on the first day of either term one (31 January 2022) or term two (26 April 2022).

PAYMENT AMOUNTS

CSEF payment amount

The CSEF is an annual payment to the school to be used towards camps, sports and/or excursion expenses for the benefit of the eligible student.

- Primary school student rate: \$125 per year.
- Secondary school student rate: \$225 per year.

The CSEF is paid directly to your child's school and will be allocated by the school towards camps, sports and/or excursion costs for your child.

For ungraded students, the rate payable is determined by the student's date of birth. For more information, see: www.education.vic.gov.au/about/programs/Pages/csef.aspx

Year 7 government school students who are CSEF recipients are also eligible for a uniform voucher. Secondary schools are required to make applications on behalf of parents/carers so please register your interest at the school.

- 1. Complete the PARENT/CARER DETAILS section.
 - Make sure that the Surname, First Name, and Customer Reference Number (CRN) details match those on your concession card. You will also need to provide your concession card to the school.
 - If you are claiming as a temporary Foster Parent or a Veteran Affairs Pensioner, you will need to provide a copy of documentation confirming your status as a temporary Foster Parent or provide your Veterans Affairs Pensioner Gold card to the school.
 - If you are seeking special consideration, mark this in the form and provide a copy of the relevant documentation.
- 2. Complete the STUDENT/S DETAILS section for students at this school.
- 3. Sign and date the form and return it to the school office as soon as possible. The CSEF program for 2022 closes on the 24 June 2022.


Our enrolment process for Year 7 had changed slightly and this year the Family Discovery Tour on Wednesday evening for will replace the previous student led tours.

Participation and fun is the key ingredient for the 2022 Wangaratta Chronicle Marathon and Fun Run presented by Garry Nash & Co Real Estate and we especially encourage students to enter the RJ Sanderson & Associates 2km Primary School Challenge and earn points for their school.

We would love to see our primary school students and/or families compete in costume – as their favourite super hero or character perhaps, although this is not a requirement.

Why should kids from your school enter?

The school with the most number of finishers will win a cash prize of \$1,000 from the event partner R J Sanderson as well as a perpetual trophy to display for the next 12 months. Every student finisher is awarded a 'finisher' point as long as they have chosen their school as their team when entering.

Smaller schools will not be disadvantaged as there is a factoring system based on the number of students in total at the school and how many students participate, so any school has the chance to win the major prize.

There will be two groups for the 2km Primary School Challenge – Racers and Chasers.

The Racers will set off at 9.45am and is for children of all ages who want to race hard and challenge themselves to achieve their best. No parents/carers are allowed to start in this wave.

The Chasers will begin at 10am and is for children of all ages. We encourage parent/carer participation and social completion of the event as a family in this wave – walking or running is permitted by all participants.

All children in both waves will receive a medal at the finish and their official time will be published on the website, however there will be no official placings or prizes for the fastest finishers in this event. Times on the website will not be separated by wave, but by age.

Primary School children do not have to be vaccinated (at this stage) to enter this event, but accompanying adults must be fully vaccinated and enter via QR code on the day.
