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

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Saver Plus – helping take the stress out of back-to-school time

The Saver Plus community program has helped over 55,000 Australians take the stress out of back-to-school time. It's free for eligible people to join. At Saver Plus, we pair you with a savings coach while you budget and save over the next 10 months.

You attend online workshops to learn tips, tricks and information to grow your budgeting and savings skills. Once you reach your agreed savings goal, ANZ matches your savings dollar-for-dollar, up to \$500. You can use that money towards education costs such as uniforms, text books, laptops or extracurricular activities such as sport or music. You could be eligible to join Saver Plus if you:

- have a Centrelink Health Care Card or Pensioner Concession Card
- are at least 18 years old
- have some regular income from work (you or your partner) including casual, part-time,
- fulltime or seasonal (we also accept child support and carer's payment as income)
- have a child at school or attend vocational education yourself.
 If you're eligible, start now and we'll help take the stress out of next year's back to school.

Look out for chocolate products in this guide or that have the Fairtrade, Rainforest Alliance or UTZ Certified logos on them to be sure your chocolate is ethical chocolate!
