



What the frog hotels can offer your family:

- Frog hotels can contribute to local biodiversity, supporting the population of native frog species. By providing a habitat for frogs, you help maintain the natural balance in your garden, reducing the need for chemical pesticides and fostering a more ecofriendly environment.
- Frog hotels offer shelter and breeding grounds for frogs which help control pests like slugs and insects in your garden. By attracting frogs, you create a natural pest management system, leading to a healthier and more sustainable garden ecosystem.

The hotels are super easy to look after, add whatever plants you would like, provide a dish of water and keep the moisture up!

Bullying No Way National week of action

The theme for 2024 is 'Everyone belongs'.

When we all feel like we belong, bullying struggles to find a place. It's about embracing who we are, respecting everyone's differences and standing up together against unkindness.

Belonging means we all have a role in preventing bullying. We're encouraged to speak up and create a safe place where everyone feels supported and respected, and our voices are heard and valued.

Bullying is an ongoing and deliberate misuse of power in relationships through repeated verbal, physical and / or social behaviour that intends to cause physical social and or psychological harm. Bullying can happen in person or online through various digital platforms. Bullying behaviour is repeated or has the potential to be repeated over time.

If you are concerned about your child's behaviour or mood, talk with them about school and ask general questions about how things are going.

Signs a parent or carer might notice include if their child:

- doesn't want to go to school or participate in school activities
- changes their method or route to school or is frightened of walking to school
- drops in academic performance
- experiences changes in sleep patterns
- experiences changes in eating patterns
- has frequent tears, anger, mood swings
- takes money from home

The signs of possible cyberbullying can be the same as signs of other bullying, but include other behaviours with phones, computers and other devices, for example:

- being hesitant about going online
- seeming nervous when a notification, message or phone call appears
- being visibly upset after using their phone or computer, or suddenly avoiding it
- closes the screen, or hides the mobile phone when others enter the room
- spending unusually long hours online

This week all classes have had conversations around this topic and watched clips on how to be an upstander not a bystander! Together we can all make a difference.
