


### **WANGARATTA FESTIVAL OF JAZZ & BLUES**

S Are they musicians? What hats might they wear?

What is happening on the stage between the musicians?

I What colour or patterns could you add?

Stay with black and white, just like the keys on a piano?

We have two performers on the poster. One looks a lot like trumpet player Vince Jones who is performing at Wangaratta Performing Arts Centre and the other could be a young woman from the National Jazz Awards where the feature instrument for 2024 is saxophone.

I How would you make their clothes eye-catching whilst on the stage?


I Many jazz and blues musicians play with others. Extend the stage and draw some more band members with them. Don't forget equipment, like microphones, speakers and lights.

They are playing music so add some more musical notes to the space.

As the festival is "Back on Track" research a jazz or blues song that has a train mention that your musicians could be playing. Add the song title or a line from a jazz or blues song about trains?

Example.... Duke Ellington wrote a famous jazz tune called "Take the A Train" or the famous blues song "Mystery Train" written and recorded by American blues musician Junior Parker which many artists such as Elvis Presley covered.
