- Aids students' action to complete waste/energy/water/bio-diversity usage audits
- Supervises students reporting to the school community
- Keeps an enthusiastic eye on the School Environmental Management Plan (SEMP) and Sustainability Action

- To maintain vegetable gardens, worm farms and compost
